# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HAWAII LABOR RELATIONS BOARD.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 89-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by amending subsection (e) to read as follows:
3	"(e) Any action taken by the board shall be by a simple
4	majority of the members of the board. All decisions of the
5	board shall be reduced to writing and shall state separately its
6	findings of fact and conclusions. Any vacancy in the board
7	shall not impair the authority of the remaining members to
8	exercise all the powers of the board. The governor may appoint
9	an acting member of the board during the temporary absence from
10	the State or illness of any regular member[-] or in the case of
11	any regular board member being unable to act for a reason such
12	as recusal. An acting member, during the acting member's term
13	of service, shall have the same powers and duties as the regular
14	member $[-]$ , but subsection (d) shall not apply to an acting
15	member."

Statutes, there are three members of the Hawaii Labor Relations Board and any action taken by the Board shall be by a simple majority. In the event where one Board member recuses himself or herself from a case, and the remaining two Board members cannot agree, the Board may be deadlocked

and unable to act.
