A BILL FOR AN ACT

MAKING AN EMERGENCY APPROPRIATION TO THE DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, AND TOURISM FROM THE ENERGY SECURITY SPECIAL FUND.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. This Act is recommended by the governor for
2	immediate passage in accordance with section 9 of article VII of
3	the Constitution of the State of Hawaii.
4	SECTION 2. The purpose of this Act is to appropriate
5	\$145,000 in energy security special funds for an emergency
6	appropriation for fiscal year 2012-2013 to staff and support the
7	Hawaii refinery task force which is established to assess the
8	impacts to changes in Hawaii's refining capacity and to provide
9	advice and recommendations on matters involving Hawaii's future
10	fuels ecosystem. The task force will serve as the principal
11	advisory group to the Governor, and if so requested, the
12	legislature, on the market disruptions facing the State
13	associated with changes in the State's refining capacity and
14	ownership, and on specific measures, alternatives and actions
15	the State should consider to maintain adequate and affordable
16	fuel supplies to meet the State's energy needs. With the
17	impending closure of Tesoro Hawaii's Kapolei refinery, and the

- 1 potential closure of Hawaii's remaining Chevron refinery, the
- 2 task force will help the State plan and prepare for changes in
- 3 Hawaii's refining capacity.
- 4 The department of business, economic development, and
- 5 tourism has identified the need for an additional \$145,000 in
- 6 energy security special funds for fiscal year 2012-2013 to
- 7 support the task force in assessing these refinery issues,
- 8 including funding for coordination and operation of the task
- 9 force, studies and assessments, and funding for a staff
- 10 position. A vacancy currently exists within the department's
- 11 energy division as a result of budget control measures and will
- 12 be filled immediately to staff the task force. This emergency
- 13 funding will ensure that the Hawaii refinery task force will be

- 16 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the energy
- 17 security special fund the sum of \$145,000 or so much thereof as
- 18 may be necessary for fiscal year 2012-2013 for the program on
- 19 environment and energy development (BED 120) to support the
- 20 Hawaii refinery task force.
- 21 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 22 business, economic development, and tourism for the purposes of
- 23 this Act.

TITLE:

A BILL FOR AN ACT MAKING AN EMERGENCY
APPROPRIATION TO THE DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS,
ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, AND TOURISM FROM THE
ENERGY SECURITY SPECIAL FUND.

PURPOSE:

To appropriate \$145,000 in energy security special funds for an emergency appropriation for fiscal year 2012-2013 for the Program on Environment and Energy Development (BED 120) to staff and support the Hawaii refinery task force.

MEANS:

An emergency appropriation out of the energy security special fund.

JUSTIFICATION:

The Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism has identified the need for an additional \$145,000 in energy security special funds for fiscal year 2012-2013 to support the task force in assessing refinery issues, including funding for coordination and operation of the task force, studies and assessments, and funding for a staff position. A vacancy currently exists within the department's energy division as a result of budget control measures and will be filled immediately to staff the task force. This emergency funding will ensure that the Hawaii refinery task force will be provided with appropriate support to meet its intended purposes in fiscal year 2012-2013.

Impact on the public: This emergency appropriation will support the Hawaii refinery task force in assessing the impacts to changes in Hawaii's refining capacity and to provide advice and recommendations on matters involving a future fuels ecosystem.

Impact on the department and other agencies:

The Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism will be able to support the Hawaii refinery task force.

\$145,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2012-2013, out of

the energy security special fund.
