A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO RECYCLING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 In 1993, the legislature convened an Energy and SECTION 1. 2 Environmental Summit aimed at identifying issues and building 3 broad-based support for state energy and environmental protection initiatives. This Summit culminated in the general 4 5 finding that Hawaii's energy resources and physical environment 6 must be managed and protected in a manner that ensures the 7 health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of the State, 8 including the preservation of the State's limited natural 9 resources for future generations. The glass advance disposal 10 fee program, created in 1994 to assist in the diversion of glass 11 containers, was born out of the collaborative findings of the 12 1993 Summit.
- 13 Currently, the glass advance disposal fee serves to fund
 14 non-redemption glass recycling programs across the State. Glass
 15 recycling lags behind the recycling of other materials because
 16 of its lower material costs and higher shipping costs. Without
 17 such programs, much of this waste would likely end up in State
 18 landfills, many which are near or over capacity.



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- 1 The purpose of this Act is to ensure that Hawaii's 2 environmental protection and sustainability efforts remain on 3 course through expanded funding mechanisms aimed at 4 strengthening Hawaii's glass recycling program. 5 SECTION 2. Section 342G-82, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 6 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 7 "(a) Every glass container importer shall pay to the 8 department an advance disposal fee. The fee shall be imposed 9 only once on the same glass container and shall not be assessed 10 on drinking glasses, cups, bowls, plates, ashtrays, and similar 11 tempered glass containers. For the period beginning [September 12 1, 1994, January 2, 2014, the fee shall be [one and one-half 13 cents per glass container. Beginning October 1, 2004, the] 14 \$ per glass container containing twelve ounces or less determined by weight or volume; and \$ per glass 15 16 container containing greater than twelve ounces determined by 17 weight or volume. The glass advance disposal fee shall only 18 apply to glass containers that are not glass deposit beverage 19 containers." 20 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 21 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
 - SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2713.
