A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LONG-TERM CARE FACILITIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Act 156, Session Laws of Hawaii 2012, is 2 amended by amending section 2 to read as follows: "SECTION 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by 3 4 adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read 5 as follows: 6 "CHAPTER 7 NURSING FACILITY SUSTAINABILITY PROGRAM 8 Title. This chapter shall be known and may be 9 cited as the "Nursing Facility Sustainability Program Act". **10** Ş Findings and declaration of necessity. It is the -2 11 intent of the legislature to establish a special fund within the 12 state treasury to receive revenue from the nursing facility 13 sustainability fee to be administered by the department [and to 14 use it to receive federal medicaid matching funds under the 15 section 1115 waiver.] of human services, which shall use the 16 revenue from the fee and associated federal medicaid matching 17 funds to make payments to nursing facilities and for other 18 purposes as set forth in this chapter.

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             -3 Definitions. As used in this chapter:
         "Continuing care retirement community" means an entity
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    providing nursing facility services, along with assisted living
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    or independent living on a contiguous campus with the number of
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    assisted living and independent living beds in the aggregate
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    being at least twice the number of nursing facility beds. For
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    purposes of this definition, "contiguous" means land adjoining
    or touching other property held by the same or related
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    organization, and includes land divided by a public road.
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         "Department" means the department of human services.
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         "Net patient service revenue" means gross inpatient
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    revenues from services provided to nursing facility patients
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    less reductions from gross inpatient revenue resulting from an
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    inability to collect payment of charges. Inpatient service
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    revenue excludes non-patient care revenues, such as revenues
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    from beauty and barber services, vending income, interest and
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    contributions, revenues from the sale of meals, and all
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    outpatient revenues. Reductions from gross revenue include
    contractual adjustments, uncompensated care, administrative,
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    courtesy, and policy discounts and adjustments, and other
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    revenue deductions.
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1 "Nursing facility" means any facility licensed pursuant to chapter 11-94.1, Hawaii administrative rules. 2 3 ["QUEST" means the demonstration project developed by the 4 department described in Hawaii's section 1115 waiver and includes the QUEST, QUEST-Net, and QUEST-ACE components. 5 6 "QUEST expanded access" means the demonstration project 7 developed by the department described in Hawaii's section 1115 8 waiver.] 9 "Resident day" means a calendar day of care provided to a **10** nursing facility resident, including the day of admission and 11 excluding the day of discharge; provided that one resident day 12 shall be deemed to exist when admission and discharge occur on 13 the same day. A resident day includes a day on which a bed is 14 held for a patient and for which the facility receives 15 compensation for holding the bed. 16 "Section 1115 waiver" means the [QUEST expanded] medicaid 17 section 1115 demonstration waiver [(Number 11-W-00001/9).] under 18 which the state medicaid program is operating. 19 -4 Nursing facility sustainability program special

(a) There is created in the state treasury the nursing

facility sustainability program special fund to be administered

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1	by the de	partment into which shall be deposited all moneys
2	collected	under this chapter.
3	(b)	Moneys in the special fund shall consist of:
4	(1)	All revenues collected or received by the department
5		from the nursing facility sustainability fee required
6		by this chapter;
7	(2)	All federal medicaid funds received by the department
8		as a result of matching expenditures made with the
9		nursing facility sustainability fees;
10	(3)	Any interest or penalties levied in conjunction with
11		the administration of this chapter; and
12	(4)	Any appropriations, federal funds, donations, gifts,
13		or moneys from any other sources.
14	(c)	Revenue from the nursing facility sustainability fee
15	shall be	used exclusively as follows:
16	(1)	No less than eighty-eight per cent of the revenue from
17		the nursing facility sustainability fee shall be used
18		to match federal medicaid funds, with the combined

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1	(2)	Twelve per cent of the revenue from the nursing
2		facility sustainability fee [shall be used by the
3		department to restore funding for the three per cent
4		reduction in reimbursements to nursing facilities
5		effective 2012, and to the extent remaining after
6		restoring the three per cent reduction for other
7		purposes; may be used by the department for other
8		departmental purposes; and
9	(3)	All moneys remaining in the special fund on
10		December 30, $[\frac{2013}{7}]$ $\underline{2014}$, shall be distributed to
11		nursing facilities within thirty days in the same
12		proportions as received from the nursing facilities.
13	(d)	The department shall utilize federal funds derived
14	from stat	e long-term care facility certified expenditures to
15	make supp	lemental payments to state long-term care facilities to
16	the exten	t permitted by federal law. The department may receive
17	intergove	rnmental transfers from the state long-term care
18	facilitie	s to support direct supplemental payments and increased
19	capitatio	n rates to health plans for the benefit of the state
20	long-term	care facilities. During any period in which the
21	nursing f	acility sustainability fee is in effect, certified
22	expenditu	res of state long-term care facilities shall not be

- 1 used to make or support direct payments to private nursing
- 2 facilities.
- 3 [(e) The nursing facility sustainability program special
- 4 fund ceiling appropriation shall be \$12,000,000 for fiscal year
- 5 2012-2013 and \$10,000,000 in federal funds for HMS 401 for
- 6 fiscal year 2012 2013.
- 7 § -5 Nursing facility sustainability fee. (a)
- 8 Effective July 1, 2012, the department shall charge and collect
- 9 a provider fee on health care items or services provided by
- 10 nursing facilities.
- 11 (b) The nursing home sustainability fee shall be based on
- 12 the net patient service revenue of all nursing facilities that
- 13 are subject to the sustainability fee, as determined by the
- 14 department.
- 15 (c) The nursing facility sustainability fee shall not
- 16 exceed four per cent of net patient service revenue and shall be
- 17 calculated and paid on a per resident day basis. The per
- 18 resident daily fee shall be the same amount for each affected
- 19 facility, except as prescribed in subsection (d)(2).
- 20 (d) In accordance with the redistribution method set forth
- 21 in title 42 Code of Federal Regulations section 433.68(e)(1) and
- 22 (2), the department shall seek a waiver of the broad-based and

1	uniformit	y provider fee requirements under federal law from
2	which to	exclude certain nursing facilities and to permit
3	certain h	igh volume medicaid nursing facilities or facilities
4	with a hi	gh number of total annual patient days to pay the
5	sustainab	ility fee at a lesser amount per resident day, as
6	follows:	
7	(1)	The department shall exempt the following nursing
8		facility providers from the nursing facility
9		sustainability fee subject to federal approval under
10		title 42 Code of Federal Regulations section
11		433.68(e)(2):
12		(A) Nursing facilities with twenty-eight or fewer
13		licensed beds;
14		(B) Nursing facilities owned or operated by the
15		Hawaii health systems corporation; and
16		(C) Continuing care retirement communities.
17	(2)	The department shall reduce the fee for high volume
18		medicaid nursing facilities or facilities with high
19		patient volumes in order to meet the redistributive
20		tests of title 42 Code of Federal Regulations section
21		433.68(e)(2).

1	(3)	The department, with agreement by the nursing facility
2		trade associations located in Hawaii, may modify, add
3		to, or reduce the categories of facilities exempt from
4		the assessment if necessary to obtain and maintain
5		approval of the waiver by the Centers for Medicare and
6		Medicaid Services, if the modification is consistent
7		with the purposes of this chapter.

- 9 (a) Nursing facilities shall pay the nursing facility
- 10 sustainability fee to the nursing facility sustainability
- 11 program special fund in accordance with this chapter.
- 12 (b) The department shall determine, with agreement by the
- 13 nursing facility trade associations located in Hawaii, the fee
- 14 rate prospectively for the applicable fiscal year.
- 15 (c) The department shall collect and each nursing facility
- 16 shall pay in twelve equal installments the nursing facility
- 17 sustainability fee in section -5 on a monthly basis, subject
- 18 to the terms of this section. The fee shall be due within
- 19 thirty days after the end of each month, with the initial
- 20 payment due on the later of July 31, 2012, or forty-five days
- 21 after the required federal approvals for the assessment and any

- 1 increase in health plan capitation payments have been secured
- 2 from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services.
- 3 § -7 Federal approval. The department shall seek a
- 4 waiver and other approvals from the Centers for Medicare and
- 5 Medicaid Services that may be necessary to implement the nursing
- 6 facility sustainability program, including the approval of the
- 7 contracts between the State and [the QUEST and QUEST expanded
- 8 access] medicaid managed care health plans.
- 9 \$ -8 Multifacility locations. If an entity conducts,
- 10 operates, or maintains more than one nursing facility, the
- 11 entity shall pay the nursing facility sustainability fee for
- 12 each nursing facility separately.
- 13 S -9 Penalties for failure to pay nursing facility
- 14 sustainability fee. (a) If a nursing facility fails to pay the
- 15 full amount of the nursing facility sustainability fee when due,
- 16 there shall be added to the fee, unless waived by the department
- 17 for reasonable cause, a penalty equal to two per cent of the fee
- 18 that was not paid when due. Any subsequent payments shall be
- 19 credited first to unpaid fee amounts rather than to penalty or
- 20 interest amounts, beginning with the most delinquent
- 21 installment.

1	(b) In addition to the penalty identified in this section,
2	the department may seek any of the following remedies for
3	failure of any nursing facility to pay its fee when due:
4	(1) Withholding any medical assistance reimbursement
5	payments until such time as the fee amount is paid in
6	full;
7	(2) Suspension or revocation of the nursing facility
8	license; or
9	(3) Development of a plan that requires the nursing
10	facility to pay any delinquent fee in installments.
11	§ -10 Enhanced rates to [QUEST expanded access] medicaid
12	managed care health plans. In accordance with title 42 Code of
13	Federal Regulations section 438, the department shall use
14	revenues from the nursing facility sustainability fee and
15	federal matching funds to enhance the capitated rates paid to
16	[the QUEST expanded access] medicaid managed care health plans
17	for the state fiscal year $[\frac{2012-2013}{2013-2014}]$ consistent with
18	the following objectives:
19	(1) The rate enhancement shall be used exclusively for
20	increasing reimbursements to private nursing
21	facilities to support the availability of services and

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2		medicaid managed care health plan enrollees;
3	(2)	The rate enhancement shall be made part of the monthly
4		capitated rates by the department to [the QUEST
5		expanded access] medicaid managed care health plans,
6		which shall provide documentation to the department
7		and the nursing facility trade associations located in
8		Hawaii certifying that the revenues received under
9		paragraph (1) are used in accordance with this
10		section;
11	(3)	The rate enhancement shall be actuarially sound and
12		approved by the federal government for federal fund
13		participation; and
14	(4)	The department shall modify the fee-for-service
15		reimbursement rates of the nursing facilities to
16		recognize the medicaid portion of the nursing facility
17		sustainability fee as an additional cost of serving
18		medicaid patients, and to provide a uniform percentage
19		increase in pre-existing facility-specific rates.
20	\$	-11 Payment of rate enhancement. The rate
21	enhanceme	nts referred to in section -10 shall be retroactive
22	to the ef	fective date of this legislation. Retroactive rate
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to ensure access to care to [QUEST expanded access]

- 1 enhancements shall be paid within thirty days of notification by
- 2 the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services to the department
- 3 of all necessary approvals.
- 5 sustainability program special fund. Notwithstanding section
- 6 37-53 and any law or administrative rule to the contrary, the
- 7 specific purposes set out in section -4(c) are established as
- 8 being pre-eminent uses of the nursing facility sustainability
- 9 program special fund and shall not be used for any other
- 10 purposes, notwithstanding any authority granted to the governor
- 11 or any other state official by any other statutory provisions
- 12 relating to the allocation or reallocation of funds.
- 13 § -13 Termination. (a) Collection of the nursing
- 14 facility sustainability fee under section -5 shall be
- 15 discontinued if:
- 16 (1) The waiver in section -7 or the enhanced capitation
- 17 rates in section -10 have not been approved by the
- 18 Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services;
- 19 (2) The department reduces funding for nursing facility
- 20 services below the state appropriation in effect on
- **21** June 30, [2012;] 2013;

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1	(3)	The department or any other state agency uses the
2		money in the special fund for any use other than the
3		uses permitted pursuant to this chapter; or

- (4) Federal financial participation to match the nursing facility sustainability fee becomes unavailable under federal law. In such case, the department shall terminate the collection of the fee beginning on the effective date of the federal statutory, regulatory, or interpretive change.
- (b) If collection of the nursing facility sustainability

 fee is discontinued as provided in this section, any remaining

 money in the special fund shall be returned to the nursing

 facilities from which the fee was collected within thirty days

 in the same proportions as received from the nursing facilities.
 - § -14 Severability. If any provision of this chapter or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of the chapter which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this chapter are severable.""
- 21 SECTION 2. Act 156, Session Laws of Hawaii 2012, is 22 amended by amending section 5 to read as follows:

- 1 "SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2012,
- 2 and shall be repealed on June 30, [2013;] 2014; provided that
- 3 section -4(c), Hawaii Revised Statutes, established by
- 4 section 2 of this Act, shall be repealed on December 31, [2013.]
- 5 2014."
- 6 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the nursing
- 7 facility sustainability program special fund the sum of
- 8 \$12,000,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
- 9 year 2013-2014 with such moneys to be used consistent with the
- 10 nursing facility sustainability program special fund.
- 11 SECTION 4. The sum appropriated shall be expended by the
- 12 department of human services for the purposes of this Act.
- 13 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 14 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 15 SECTION 6. This Act, upon its approval, shall take effect
- 16 on June 29, 2013.

Nursing Facility Sustainability Program; Nursing Facility Sustainability Program Special Fund

Description:

Amends Act 156, Session Laws of Hawaii 2012, to continue the Nursing Facility Sustainability Program by extending the sunset date of the Act, updating the referral dates in the statute, and appropriating funding out of the nursing facility sustainability program special fund for fiscal year 2013-2014. Effective June 29, 2013. Repeals June 30, 2014. (SD1)

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
