A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LONG-TERM CARE FACILITIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Act 156, Session Laws of Hawaii 2012, is 2 amended by amending section 2 to read as follows: 3 "SECTION 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by 4 adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read 5 as follows: 6 "CHAPTER NURSING FACILITY SUSTAINABILITY PROGRAM 7 8 -1 Title. This chapter shall be known and may be cited as the "Nursing Facility Sustainability Program Act". 9 10 -2 Findings and declaration of necessity. It is the intent of the legislature to establish a special fund within the 11 12 state treasury to receive revenue from the nursing facility 13 sustainability fee to be administered by the department [and to 14 use it to receive federal medicaid matching funds under the 15 section 1115 waiver.], which shall use the revenue from the fee 16 and associated federal medicaid matching funds to make payments 17 to nursing facilities and for other purposes as set forth in 18 this chapter.
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             -3 Definitions. As used in this chapter:
         "Continuing care retirement community" means an entity
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    providing nursing facility services, along with assisted living
    or independent living on a contiguous campus with the number of
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    assisted living and independent living beds in the aggregate
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    being at least twice the number of nursing facility beds. For
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    purposes of this definition, "contiguous" means land adjoining
    or touching other property held by the same or related
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    organization, and includes land divided by a public road.
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         "Department" means the department of human services.
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         "Net patient service revenue" means gross inpatient
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    revenues from services provided to nursing facility patients
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    less reductions from gross inpatient revenue resulting from an
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    inability to collect payment of charges. Inpatient service
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    revenue excludes non-patient care revenues, such as revenues
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    from beauty and barber services, vending income, interest and
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    contributions, revenues from the sale of meals, and all
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    outpatient revenues. Reductions from gross revenue include
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    contractual adjustments, uncompensated care, administrative,
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    courtesy, and policy discounts and adjustments, and other
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    revenue deductions.
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1 "Nursing facility" means any facility licensed pursuant to 2 chapter 11-94.1, Hawaii administrative rules. 3 ["QUEST" means the demonstration project developed by the 4 department described in Hawaii's section 1115 waiver and 5 includes the QUEST, QUEST-Net, and QUEST-ACE components. 6 "QUEST expanded access" means the demonstration project 7 developed by the department described in Hawaii's section 1115 8 waiver.1 9 "Resident day" means a calendar day of care provided to a 10 nursing facility resident, including the day of admission and 11 excluding the day of discharge; provided that one resident day 12 shall be deemed to exist when admission and discharge occur on 13 the same day. A resident day includes a day on which a bed is 14 held for a patient and for which the facility receives 15 compensation for holding the bed. 16 ["Section 1115 waiver" means the OUEST expanded medicaid 17 section 1115 demonstration waiver (Number 11 W 00001/9). 18 -4 Nursing facility sustainability program special 19 (a) There is created in the state treasury the nursing 20 facility sustainability program special fund to be administered 21 by the department into which shall be deposited all moneys 22 collected under this chapter.

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1	(b)	Moneys in the special fund shall consist of:
2	(1)	All revenues collected or received by the department
3		from the nursing facility sustainability fee required
4		by this chapter;
5	(2)	All federal medicaid funds received by the department
6		as a result of matching expenditures made with the
7		nursing facility sustainability fees;
8	(3)	Any interest or penalties levied in conjunction with
9		the administration of this chapter; and
10	(4)	Any appropriations, federal funds, donations, gifts,
11		or moneys from any other sources.
12	(c)	Revenue from the nursing facility sustainability fee
13	shall be	used exclusively as follows:
14	(1)	No less than eighty-eight per cent of the revenue from
15		the nursing facility sustainability fee shall be used
16		to match federal medicaid funds, with the combined
17		total to be used to enhance capitated rates to [the
18		QUEST expanded access plans medicaid managed care
19		health plans for the purpose of increasing medicaid
20		payments to private nursing facilities;
21	(2)	Twelve per cent of the revenue from the nursing
22		facility sustainability fee [shall be used by the

1		department to restore funding for the three per cent
2		reduction in reimbursements to nursing facilities
3		effective 2012, and to the extent remaining after
4		restoring the three per cent reduction for other
5		purposes; may be used by the department for other
6		departmental purposes; and
7	(3)	All moneys remaining in the special fund on
8		December 30, $[\frac{2013}{7}]$ $\underline{2014}$, shall be distributed to
9		nursing facilities within thirty days in the same
10		proportions as received from the nursing facilities.
11	(d)	The department shall utilize federal funds derived
12	from state	e long-term care facility certified expenditures to
13	make supp	lemental payments to state long-term care facilities to
14	the exten	t permitted by federal law. The department may receive
15	intergove:	rnmental transfers from the state long-term care
16	facilitie	s to support direct supplemental payments and increased
17	capitation	n rates to health plans for the benefit of the state
18	long-term	care facilities. During any period in which the
19	nursing fa	acility sustainability fee is in effect, certified
20	expenditu	res of state long-term care facilities shall not be
21	used to ma	ake or support direct payments to private nursing
22	facilitie	S.

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1 [(e) The nursing facility sustainability program special 2 fund ceiling appropriation shall be \$12,000,000 for fiscal year 3 2012-2013 and \$10,000,000 in federal funds for HMS 401 for 4 fiscal year 2012-2013.] 5 -5 Nursing facility sustainability fee. (a) 6 Effective July 1, 2012, the department shall charge and collect 7 a provider fee on health care items or services provided by 8 nursing facilities. 9 (b) The nursing home sustainability fee shall be based on 10 the net patient service revenue of all nursing facilities that 11 are subject to the sustainability fee, as determined by the 12 department. 13 The nursing facility sustainability fee shall not 14 exceed four per cent of net patient service revenue and shall be calculated and paid on a per resident day basis. The per 15 resident daily fee shall be the same amount for each affected 16 17 facility, except as prescribed in subsection (d)(2). In accordance with the redistribution method set forth 18 (d) in title 42 Code of Federal Regulations section 433.68(e)(1) and 19 (2), the department shall seek a waiver of the broad-based and 20 uniformity provider fee requirements under federal law from 21

5	(1)	The department shall exempt the following nursing
6		facility providers from the nursing facility

10		(A) Nursing facilities with twenty-eight or fewer
11		licensed beds;
12		(B) Nursing facilities owned or operated by the
13		Hawaii health systems corporation; and
14		(C) Continuing care retirement communities.
15	(2)	The department shall reduce the fee for high volume
16		medicaid nursing facilities or facilities with high
17		patient volumes in order to meet the redistributive
18		tests of title 42 Code of Federal Regulations section
19		433.68(e)(2).
20	(3)	The department, with agreement by the nursing facility
21		trade associations located in Hawaii, may modify, add

to, or reduce the categories of facilities exempt from

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1	the assessment if necessary to obtain and maintain
2	approval of the waiver by the Centers for Medicare and
3	Medicaid Services, if the modification is consistent
4	with the purposes of this chapter.
5	§ -6 Nursing facility sustainability fee assessment.
6	(a) Nursing facilities shall pay the nursing facility
7	sustainability fee to the nursing facility sustainability
8	program special fund in accordance with this chapter.
9	(b) The department shall determine, with agreement by the
10	nursing facility trade associations located in Hawaii, the fee
11	rate prospectively for the applicable fiscal year.
12	(c) The department shall collect and each nursing facility
13	shall pay in twelve equal installments the nursing facility
14	sustainability fee in section -5 on a monthly basis, subject
15	to the terms of this section. The fee shall be due within
16	thirty days after the end of each month, with the initial
17	payment due on the later of July 31, 2012, or forty-five days
18	after the required federal approvals for the assessment and any
19	increase in health plan capitation payments have been secured
20	from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services.
21	§ -7 Federal approval. The department shall seek a
22	waiver and other approvals from the Centers for Medicare and

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- 1 Medicaid Services that may be necessary to implement the nursing
- 2 facility sustainability program, including the approval of the
- 3 contracts between the State and [the QUEST and QUEST expanded
- 4 access] medicaid managed care health plans.
- 6 operates, or maintains more than one nursing facility, the
- 7 entity shall pay the nursing facility sustainability fee for
- 8 each nursing facility separately.
- 9 S -9 Penalties for failure to pay nursing facility
- 10 sustainability fee. (a) If a nursing facility fails to pay the
- 11 full amount of the nursing facility sustainability fee when due,
- 12 there shall be added to the fee, unless waived by the department
- 13 for reasonable cause, a penalty equal to two per cent of the fee
- 14 that was not paid when due. Any subsequent payments shall be
- 15 credited first to unpaid fee amounts rather than to penalty or
- 16 interest amounts, beginning with the most delinguent
- 17 installment.
- (b) In addition to the penalty identified in this section,
- 19 the department may seek any of the following remedies for
- 20 failure of any nursing facility to pay its fee when due:

1	(1)	withholding any medical assistance reimbursement
2		payments until such time as the fee amount is paid in
3		full;
4	(2)	Suspension or revocation of the nursing facility
5		license; or
6	(3)	Development of a plan that requires the nursing
7		facility to pay any delinquent fee in installments.

16	(1)	The rate enhancement shall be used exclusively for
17		increasing reimbursements to private nursing

19		to ensure access to care to [QUEST expanded access]
20		medicaid managed care health plan enrollees;
21	(2)	The rate enhancement shall be made part of the monthly
22		capitated rates by the department to [the QUEST
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1		expanded access] medicaid managed care health plans,
2		which shall provide documentation to the department
3		and the nursing facility trade associations located in
4		Hawaii certifying that the revenues received under
5		paragraph (1) are used in accordance with this
6		section;
7	(3)	The rate enhancement shall be actuarially sound and
8		approved by the federal government for federal fund
9		participation; and
10	(4)	The department shall modify the fee-for-service
11		reimbursement rates of the nursing facilities to
12		recognize the medicaid portion of the nursing facility
13		sustainability fee as an additional cost of serving
14		medicaid patients, and to provide a uniform percentage
15		increase in pre-existing facility-specific rates.
16	\$	-11 Payment of rate enhancement. The rate
17	enhanceme	nts referred to in section -10 shall be retroactive
18	to the ef	fective date of this legislation. Retroactive rate
19	enhanceme	nts shall be paid within thirty days of notification by
20	the Cente	rs for Medicare and Medicaid Services to the department
21	of all ne	cessary approvals.

15		Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services;
16	(2)	The department reduces funding for nursing facility
17		services below the state appropriation in effect on
18		June 30, [2012;] <u>2013;</u>
19	(3)	The department or any other state agency uses the
20		money in the special fund for any use other than the
21		uses permitted pursuant to this chapter; or

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Federal financial participation to match the nursing

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              facility sustainability fee becomes unavailable under
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              federal law. In such case, the department shall
              terminate the collection of the fee beginning on the
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              effective date of the federal statutory, regulatory,
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              or interpretive change.
              If collection of the nursing facility sustainability

    fee is discontinued as provided in this section, any remaining
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    money in the special fund shall be returned to the nursing
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    facilities from which the fee was collected within thirty days
    in the same proportions as received from the nursing facilities.
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             -14 Severability. If any provision of this chapter or
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    the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held
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    invalid, the invalidity shall not affect other provisions or
    applications of the chapter which can be given effect without
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    the invalid provision or application, and to this end the
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    provisions of this chapter are severable.""
         SECTION 2. Act 156, Session Laws of Hawaii 2012, is
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    amended by amending section 5 to read as follows:
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         "SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2012,
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    and shall be repealed on June 30, [2013;] 2014; provided that
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               -4(c), Hawaii Revised Statutes, established by

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- 1 section 2 of this Act, shall be repealed on December 31, [2013.]
- 2 2014."
- 3 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the nursing
- 4 facility sustainability program special fund the sum of
- 5 \$12,000,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
- 6 year 2013-2014 with such moneys to be used consistent with the
- 7 nursing facility sustainability program special fund.
- 8 SECTION 4. The sum appropriated shall be expended by the
- 9 department of human services for the purposes of this Act.
- 10 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 11 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 12 SECTION 6. This Act, upon its approval, shall take effect
- 13 on June 29, 2013.
