RELATING TO ENERGY.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 269-101.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
2	amended to read as follows:			
3	"[+]\$269-101.5[+] Maximum capacity of eligible customer-			
4	generator. The eligible customer-generator shall have a			
5	capacity of not more than [fifty] kilowatts; provided			
6	that the public utilities commission may increase the maximum			
7	allowable capacity that eligible customer-generators may have to			
8	an amount greater than [fifty] kilowatts by rule or			
9	order."			
10	SECTION 2. Section 269-102, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
11	amended by amending its title and subsection (a) to read as			
12	follows:			
13	"§269-102 Standard contract or tariff; competitive bidding			
14	process; rate structure. (a) Every electric utility shall			
15	develop a standard contract or tariff providing for net energy			
16	metering and shall make this contract available to eligible

14	service area when the combined total peak generating capacity of
