A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRAUMATIC BRAIN INJURIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	TON 1. Section 286-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
2	amended by adding two new definitions to be appropriately				
3	inserted and to read as follows:				
4	" <u>"Al</u>	l-terrain vehicle" means a motorized flotation-tired			
5	vehicle o	f not less than three low pressure tires, but not more			
6	than six	tires, that is limited in engine displacement of less			
7	than 960	cubic centimeters, and that has a net weight of not			
8	more than 1,800 pounds.				
9	"Saf	ety helmet" means a helmet that:			
10	(1)	Meets the requirements of the Federal Motor Vehicle			
11		Safety Standard 218, title 49 Code of Federal			
12		Regulations section 571.218;			
13	(2)	Is worn on the person's head and is fastened with			
14		helmet or chin straps; and			
15	(3)	Is of a size that fits the person's head securely			
16		without excessive lateral or vertical movement."			

1	SECTION 2. Chapter 286, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to part IV to be appropriately
3	designated and to read as follows:
4	"§286- Operation of all-terrain vehicles; safety helmet.
5	(a) No person under the age of eighteen shall operate, ride, or
6	otherwise be propelled on an all-terrain vehicle unless the
7	person wears a safety helmet.
8	(b) Each person engaged in the business of leasing or
9	renting an all-terrain vehicle shall furnish a safety helmet to
10	each lessee or renter under the age of eighteen who will operate
11	or ride in the all-terrain vehicle.
12	(c) A person who violates this section shall be subject to
13	penalties under section 286-82."
14	SECTION 3. Section 286-81, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
15	amended by amending subsections (a) and (b) to read as follows:
16	"(a) No person shall:
17	(1) Operate a motorcycle or motor scooter, on any highway
18	in the State unless the person and any passenger the
19	person carries on the motorcycle or motor scooter
20	wears:

-1		(A)	Safety glasses, goggles, or a face shield, in the
2			case of a motorcycle or motor scooter that is not
3			equipped with windscreens or windshields; and
4		(B)	Any other protective devices[, other than a
5			safety helmet, required by law and rules adopted
6			by the director.
7		For	the purpose of meeting the requirements of this
8		para	graph, a required device shall meet the
9		spec	ifications and requirements established by <u>law and</u>
10		rule	s adopted by the director;
11	(2)	Leas	e or rent a motorcycle or motor scooter to another
12		pers	on unless the person furnishes:
13		(A)	Safety glasses, goggles, or a face shield, in the
14			case of a motorcycle or motor scooter that is not
15			equipped with windscreens or windshields; and
16		(B)	Any other protective devices required by <u>law and</u>
17			the rules adopted by the director for the use of
18			the person or persons intending to operate or
19			ride as a passenger on the motorcycle or motor
20			scooter; provided that any person to whom a
21			motorcycle or motor scooter is leased or rented

1		may furnish for the person's own use the		
2		protective devices required by this part.		
3		For the purposes of meeting the requirements of this		
4		paragraph, a required device shall meet the		
5		specifications and requirements established by <u>law and</u>		
6		rules adopted by the director; or		
7	(3)	Sell or offer for sale or furnish any safety helmet,		
8		safety glasses, goggles, face shield, windscreen,		
9		windshield, or other protective devices represented to		
10		meet the requirements of this part unless the device		
11		meets the specifications and requirements established		
12		by <u>law and</u> rules adopted by the director.		
13	(b)	No person less than eighteen years of age shall		
14	operate o	r ride as a passenger on a motorcycle or motor scooter		
15	on any highway in the State unless the person wears a safety			
16	helmet securely fastened with a helmet or chin strap."			
17	SECTION 4. Section 291C-152, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
18	amended to read as follows:			
19	" [+]	§291C-152[] Riding on motorcycles. (a) A person		
20	operating	a motorcycle shall ride only upon the permanent and		
21	regular seat attached thereto, and such operator shall not carry			
22	any other	person nor shall any other person ride on a motorcycle

- 1 unless the motorcycle is designed to carry more than one person,
- 2 in which event a passenger may ride upon the permanent and
- 3 regular seat if designed for two persons, or upon another seat
- 4 firmly attached to the motorcycle at the rear or side of the
- 5 operator.
- 6 (b) A person shall ride upon a motorcycle only while
- 7 sitting astride the seat, facing forward, with one leg on each
- 8 side of the motorcycle.
- 9 (c) No person shall operate a motorcycle while carrying
- 10 any package, bundle, or other article which prevents the person
- 11 from keeping both hands on the handlebars.
- 12 (d) No operator shall carry any person, nor shall any
- 13 person ride, in a position that will interfere with the
- 14 operation or control of the motorcycle or the view of the
- 15 operator.
- (e) No person under the age of eighteen shall operate a
- 17 motorcycle or ride as a passenger on a motorcycle upon any
- 18 highway of the State, unless that person is wearing a safety
- 19 helmet pursuant to section 286-81."
- 20 SECTION 5. Section 291C-195, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 21 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

- 7 SECTION 7. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 8 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 9 begun before its effective date.
- 10 SECTION 8. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 11 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 12 SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Traumatic Brain Injuries; Helmets; All-terrain Vehicles; Motorcycles; Mopeds; Motor Scooters

Description:

Requires helmet use for individuals under the age of eighteen operating or riding motorcycles, motor scooters, mopeds, and all-terrain vehicles. Requires persons engaging in the business of renting these vehicles to furnish a safety helmet to renters, under the age of eighteen for motorcycles, motor scooters, mopeds, and all-terrain vehicles, who will drive or ride on these vehicles.
