## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TRANS FAT.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 3 and to read as follows: 4 "§302A- Trans fat; restricting availability at public
- 5 **schools.** (a) For the purposes of this section: 6 "Extended school day" means the school day, plus any 7 additional time that a student spends on school grounds before 8 or after the school day for the purpose of participating in a 9 school-sanctioned activity or child care program.
- 10 "Industrially produced trans fat" means vegetable 11 shortening, margarine, or any type of partially hydrogenated 12 vegetable oil that contains more than zero grams of trans fat 13 per serving as labeled.
- 14 "School food service establishment" means a place that 15 regularly sells or serves a food or beverage item or school 16 meals on a public school campus.
- 17 "School meals" has the same meaning as set forth in section
- 18 302A-101.
