A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE ELECTIONS COMMISSION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 11-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by amending the definition of "chief election officer"
- 3 to read as follows:
- 4 ""Chief election officer"[7] means the individual
- 5 [appointed by the elections commission] nominated and, by and
- 6 with the advice and consent of the senate, appointed by the
- 7 governor pursuant to section 11-1.6 to supervise state
- 8 elections."
- 9 SECTION 2. Section 11-1.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 10 amended to read as follows:
- 11 " \S 11-1.5 Office of elections established. [$\frac{\langle a \rangle}{\langle a \rangle}$] There is
- 12 established an office of elections to provide support to the
- 13 chief election officer. The office shall be placed within the
- 14 department of accounting and general services for administrative
- 15 purposes. The chief election officer shall be the administrator
- 16 of the office of elections. Except for exercising the right to
- 17 vote, the full-time employees of the office of elections shall

- 1 not support, advocate, or aid in the election or defeat of any
- 2 candidate for public office.
- 3 [(b) The office of elections shall provide staff support
- 4 to the elections commission, as requested by the elections
- 5 commission.]"
- 6 SECTION 3. Section 11-1.6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 7 amended as follows:
- 8 1. By amending subsection (a) to read:
- 9 "(a) The chief election officer shall be appointed by the
- 10 [elections commission,] governor and subject to the advice and
- 11 consent of the senate, without regard to chapter 76. [The
- 12 appointment shall not be subject to the advice and consent of
- 13 the senate. In the event of a vacancy, the [elections
- 14 commission] governor shall [meet] expeditiously [to] select and
- 15 appoint a new chief election officer to serve the remainder of
- 16 the unexpired term [-], subject to the advice and consent of the
- 17 senate."
- 18 2. By amending subsections (f) and (g) to read:
- 19 "(f) The chief election officer may petition the
- 20 [elections commission] governor for reappointment. The
- 21 [elections commission] governor may reappoint an incumbent chief
- 22 election officer based on the performance of the chief election



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1	officer[.]; provided that the reappointment shall be subject to	
2	the advic	e and consent of the senate. The [elections	
3	commissio	$_{ m m}$] governor may authorize the chief election officer to	
4	hold offi	ce until a successor is appointed.	
5	(g) The chief election officer may be removed by the		
6	[elections commission] governor at any time for good cause."		
7	SECTION 4. Section 11-7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
8	repealed.		
9	[" [\$	11-7] Elections commission. (a) There is established	
10	an electi	ons commission within the department of accounting and	
11	general services for administrative purposes. The elections		
12	commission shall consist of nine members who shall be selected		
13	as follows:		
14	(1)	The president of the senate shall select two elections	
15		commission members;	
16	(2)	The speaker of the house of representatives shall	
17		select two elections commission members;	
18	(3)	The senators belonging to a party or parties different	
19		from the president of the senate shall designate one	
20		senator to select two elections commission members;	
21	(4)	The representatives belonging to a party or parties	
22		different from the speaker of the house of	

1	representatives shall designate one representative to
2	select two elections commission members; and
3	(5) One member, who shall serve as chairperson of the
4	elections commission, shall be selected by the members
5	of the elections commission selected pursuant to
6	paragraphs (1) to (4);
7	provided that each group of four elections commission members
8	selected by each house shall include one elections commission
9	member from each of the four counties.
10	(b) The chairperson of the elections commission under
11	subsection (a)(5) shall be selected by a two-thirds vote.
12	(c) A vacancy in the elections commission shall be filled
13	in the same manner as the original appointment as specified in
14	subsection (a) within fifteen days. A vacancy in the elections
15	commission shall be filled with a person from the same county as
16	the departing elections commission member. Elections commission
17	member vacancies not filled within the times specified shall be
18	filled promptly thereafter by the chief justice of the supreme
19	court.
20	(d) The elections commission shall act by majority vote of
21	its membership and shall establish its own procedures, except as
22	may be provided by law.

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         (e) Notwithstanding section 26 34, elections commission
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    member appointments shall not be subject to senatorial
    confirmation.
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         (f) The term of the elections commissioners shall be four
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    years, except that with respect to the terms of the initial
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    elections commission members, one member selected from each of
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    subsection (a) (1) to (4) shall serve for a term of two years.
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         (q) The elections commissioners shall serve without
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    compensation, but shall be reimbursed for reasonable expenses,
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    including travel expenses, necessary for the performance of
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    their duties."]
         SECTION 5. Section 11-7.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
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    repealed.
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         ["[$11-7.5] Duties of the elections commission. The
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    duties of the elections commission are to:
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         (1) Hold public hearings;
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         (2) Investigate and hold hearings for receiving evidence
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              of any violations and complaints;
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         (3) Adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91;
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         (4) Employ, without regard to chapter 76, a full-time
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              chief election officer, pursuant to section 11-1.6;
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              and
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(5) Advise the chief election officer on matters relating
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              to elections."]
         SECTION 6. Section 11-8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
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    repealed.
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         ["[$11-8] Elections commission; political activities. (a)
    No elections commission member shall take an active part in
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    political management or in political campaigns.
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         (b) Each elections commission member shall retain the
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    right to:
         (1) Register and vote as the elections commission member
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              chooses in any election;
         (2) Participate in the nonpartisan activities of a civic,
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              community, social, labor, or professional
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              organization, or of a similar organization;
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         (3) Be a member of a political party or other political
              organization and participate in its activities to the
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              extent consistent with law;
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         (4) Make a financial contribution to a political party or
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              organization;
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         (5) Serve as an election judge or clerk or in a similar
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              position to perform nonpartisan election duties, as
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              prescribed by law; and
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1	(6)	Otherwise participate fully in public affairs, except	
2		as prohibited by law, in a manner which does not	
3		materially compromise the elections commission	
4		member's efficiency or integrity as an elections	
5		commission member or the neutrality, efficiency, or	
6		integrity of the elections commission.	
7	(c)	An elections commission member may request an advisory	
8	opinion f	rom the state ethics commission to determine whether a	
9	particula	r activity constitutes or would constitute a violation	
10	of the code of ethics or this section."]		
11	SECT	TION 7. Section 11-8.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
12	repealed.		
13	[" [§	11-8.5] Elections review program. The elections	
14	commissic	n shall develop and implement an elections review	
15	program t	•••	
16	(1)	Review the operation and performance of elections;	
17	(2)	Make recommendations to the chief election officer on	
18		methods to improve elections;	
19	(3)	Establish policies for the administration of an	
20		elections observer program, to include ensuring the	
21		validity and reliability of election results;	

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1	(4)	Conduct a biennial evaluation of the operation of
2		elections;
3	(5)	Submit the findings and recommendations from the
4		biennial evaluation to the legislature, not less than
5		twenty days prior to the convening of each regular
6		session held in odd-numbered years; and
7	(6)	Adopt rules in accordance with chapter 91 to carry out
8		the purposes of this section."]
9	SECT	ION 8. Section 11-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
10	repealed.	
1	[" [\$	11-9] Exemptions. The elections commission shall be
12	exempt fr	om section [26-35(a)(1), (4), and (5)] and shall:
13	(1)	Make direct communications with the governor and
14		legislature;
15	(2)	Make all decisions regarding employment, appointment,
16		promotion, transfer, demotion, discharge, and job
17		descriptions of all officers and employees of or under
18		the jurisdiction of the elections commission without
19		the approval of the comptroller; and
20	(3)	Purchase all supplies, equipment, or furniture without
21	•	the approval of the comptroller.

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- 1 The elections commission shall follow all applicable
- 2 personnel laws."]
- 3 SECTION 9. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 4 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 5 SECTION 10. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
