A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE REGENTS CANDIDATE ADVISORY COUNCIL.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that while the candidate 2 advisory council for the board of regents of the University of 3 Hawaii has nominated many outstanding appointees to the board, 4 important concerns have been raised as to the selection process. 5 Since the passage of Act 56, Session Laws of Hawaii 2007, to implement the amendments to article X, section 6, of the state 6 constitution, a number of issues have arisen from the new method 7 8 of regent selection that hampered the work of the regents 9 candidate advisory council and led to questions regarding the 10 final selection of appointees during the senate confirmation 11 process. 12 The legislature further finds that on August 29, 2012, 13 pursuant to senate rule 20, the senate president appointed a 14 senate special committee on accountability to conduct 15 informational briefings to review the oversight, accountability,

and transparency of the operational and financial management of

the University of Hawaii's athletic department.

1 During the informational briefings, the committee focused 2 on, among other things, the oversight and transparency of the 3 university's fiscal and operational administration, including 4 the role of the board of regents. The informational briefings reaffirmed the importance of granting the governor the authority 5 6 to select and appoint regents on the basis of how each regent's 7 individual strengths will add to and complement the overall 8 quality of the board of regents. It has become clear that the 9 governor will not be able to adequately select nominees to the 10 board of regents unless the governor has the ability to request 11 new nominees if the governor is unable to make quality 12 appointments from the list provided by the regents candidate 13 advisory council. 14 The purpose of this Act is to give the governor the authority to reject nominees presented by the regents candidate 15 advisory council and require the regents candidate advisory 16 17 council to provide new nominees to the governor within sixty 18 days. SECTION 2. Section 304A-104.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 19 20 amended to read as follows: 21 "§304A-104.5 Regents candidate advisory council for the

board of regents of the University of Hawaii. (a) There is

- 4 the board of regents shall be nominated and, by and with the
- 5 consent of the senate, appointed by the governor. The regents
- 6 candidate advisory council shall establish the criteria for
- 7 qualifying, screening, and presenting to the governor candidates
- 8 for membership on the board of regents. The regents candidate
- 9 advisory council shall be attached to the University of Hawaii
- 10 for administrative purposes.
- 11 (b) Except as provided in subsection (c), the regents
- 12 candidate advisory council shall present no fewer than two and
- 13 no more than four qualified candidates for each seat on the
- 14 board of regents to the governor within:
- (1) Sixty days of a vacancy that arises by resignation,
- death, or removal by the governor; or
- 17 (2) One hundred twenty days prior to the expiration of a
- 18 term.
- 19 [The regents candidate advisory council shall be deemed to have
- 20 fulfilled its obligation under this section upon presentation of
- 21 the names of the minimum number of candidates required to be
- 22 presented for each seat or seats on the board of regents.

1	(2)	Screen and qualify candidates for each position on the
2		board of regents based on their background,
3		experience, and potential for discharging the
4		responsibilities of a member of the board of regents;
5	(3)	Publicly advertise pending vacancies and actively
6		solicit and accept applications from potential
7		candidates;
8	(4)	Develop and implement a fair, independent, and
9		nonpartisan procedure for selecting candidates to
10		serve on the board of regents;
11	(5)	Ensure student involvement by establishing a student
12		advisory group composed of:
13		(A) The senior student affairs officer of the
14		University of Hawaii system;
15		(B) No fewer than three student representatives from
16		the University of Hawaii student caucus who shall
17		represent, to the maximum extent possible, the
18		interests of the various University of Hawaii
19		campuses on each island; and
20		(C) No fewer than three student life advisors who
21		shall represent, to the maximum extent possible,

1		the interests of the various University of Hawaii	
2		campuses on each island,	
3		who shall work with and assist the regents candidate	
4		advisory council to recruit and evaluate candidates	
5		for the student member of the board of regents and	
6		make recommendations to the regents candidate advisory	
7		council based on the qualifications of the candidates

9	(6)	Require each candidate to disclose any existing or	
10		anticipated contracts with the University of Hawaii or	
11		any existing or anticipated financial transactions

15	names of	candidates to the public through the University of

council shall present the governor with a new list of candidates 1 2 that meets the requirements of this section. If the governor 3 rejects specific candidates from the list, within sixty days of 4 each rejection, the regents candidate advisory council shall 5 present the governor with a new candidate for each rejected candidate. The regents candidate advisory council shall be 6 7 deemed to have fulfilled its obligation under this section upon 8 the filling of all seats on the board of regents. 9 [(e)] (f) For each board seat to be filled, the governor shall select one nominee from among the candidates submitted by 10 11 the regents candidate advisory council. $[\frac{f}{f}]$ (g) The regents candidate advisory council shall 12 13 consist of seven members to be appointed without regard to section 26-34 as follows: 14 One member shall be appointed by the president of the 15 (1)16 senate; 17 (2) One member shall be appointed by the speaker of the 18 house of representatives; One member shall be appointed by the governor; 19 (3) (4) One member shall be appointed by one of the co-chairs 20 of the All Campus Council of Faculty Senate Chairs of 21

- 1 The regents candidate advisory council shall be selected in 2 a wholly nonpartisan manner. Appointees to the regents 3 candidate advisory council shall have a general understanding of the purposes of higher education, the mission of the University 4 5 of Hawaii system, and the responsibilities of the board of 6 regents. Appointees shall be individuals who are widely viewed 7 as having placed the broad public interest ahead of special interests, having achieved a high level of prominence in their 8 9 respective professions, and being respected members of the 10 community. 11 [(g)] (h) Members of the regents candidate advisory 12 council shall serve [four-year terms.] for the duration of the 13 term of the member's appointing authority, up to a maximum of 14 four years per term. 15 $\left[\frac{h}{h}\right]$ (i) If a vacancy occurs, a successor shall be 16 appointed in the same manner and subject to the same 17 qualifications as the person's predecessor. The person 18 appointed to fill a vacancy shall serve for the remainder of the term of the person's predecessor. 19 20 $\left[\frac{1}{2}\right]$ (j) The regents candidate advisory council shall
- operate in a wholly nonpartisan manner. No individual, while a
 member of the regents candidate advisory council, shall run for

- 1 or hold any elected office under the United States or the State
- 2 or any of its political subdivisions.
- $\frac{3}{(i)}$ The members of the regents candidate advisory
- 4 council shall choose a chairperson from among themselves. A
- 5 majority of all the members to which the regents candidate
- 6 advisory council is entitled shall constitute a quorum to
- 7 conduct business. The concurrence of a majority of all the
- 8 members to which the regents candidate advisory council is
- 9 entitled shall be necessary to make any action of the regents
- 10 candidate advisory council valid. The regents candidate
- 11 advisory council shall meet annually and at other times as
- 12 necessary. The regents candidate advisory council shall be
- 13 exempt from part I of chapter 92.
- 14 $\left[\frac{k}{k}\right]$ (1) Members of the regents candidate advisory
- 15 council shall serve without compensation but shall be reimbursed
- 16 for expenses, including travel, board, and lodging expenses,
- 17 necessary for the performance of their duties.
- 18 $\left[\frac{1}{2}\right]$ (m) Notwithstanding chapter 92F or any other law to
- 19 the contrary, all information required by the regents candidate
- 20 advisory council shall be confidential, including without
- 21 limitation, all council information obtained, reviewed, or
- 22 considered before and after council decisionmaking.

- 1 Confidential regents candidate advisory council information
- 2 shall include documents, data, or other information that are not
- 3 of public record, including without limitation, personal
- 4 financial information; the names of applicants; applications and
- 5 the personal, financial, and other information contained therein
- 6 submitted by the applicants to the regents candidate advisory
- 7 council; interviews; schedules; reports; studies; background
- 8 checks; credit reports; surveys and reports prepared for or on
- 9 the regents candidate advisory council's behalf; the results of
- 10 any evaluations or assessments conducted by the regents
- 11 candidate advisory council; the substance and details of any
- 12 discussions with regents candidate advisory council members; and
- 13 the substance and details of discussions and deliberations of
- 14 the regents candidate advisory council and any of its committees
- 15 during meetings."
- 16 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 17 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 18 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.

University of Hawaii; Board of Regents; Regents Candidate Advisory Council; Governor

Description:

Amends section 304A-104.5, HRS, to give the governor the authority to reject candidates to the board of regents of the University of Hawaii presented by the regents candidate advisory council and require the regents candidate advisory council to present new candidates within sixty days. Specifies that each member of the regents candidate advisory council shall serve for the duration of the term of the member's appointing authority, up to a maximum of four years per term. Effective 07/01/2050. (SD2)
