A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HUMAN SERVICES.

	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:
1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that there are up to
2	three hundred eight QUEST expanded access beneficiaries on Oahu
3	who are unable to receive nonmedical transportation and case
4	management services through their medicaid plans. These two
5	services were found to be paid through kupuna care or federal
6	Older Americans Act Title III funds targeted to near-medicaid
7	individuals to prevent and delay the need for institutional care
8	and their spend down to medicaid. Medicaid beneficiaries
9	currently receiving these services continue to need these
10	services.
11	Therefore, the purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds
12	to enable aging and disabled individuals on medicaid in the City
13	and County of Honolulu to continue to receive appropriate long-
14	term care and services.
15	SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
16	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
