## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE COLORECTAL CANCER SCREENING PILOT PROGRAM.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that of cancers affecting 2 men and women, cancer of the colon and rectum, also known as 3 colorectal cancer, is the second leading killer in the United States. According to the National Cancer Institute, in 2007, 142,627 people in the United States were diagnosed with, and 5 6 53,219 people died from, colorectal cancer. Based on rates from 2006 through 2008, 5.08 per cent of men and women born today will be diagnosed with colorectal cancer during their lifetime. 8 Since colorectal cancer almost always develops from precancerous 9 polyps in the colon or rectum, screening tests are an easy and 10 effective method to find precancerous polyps and detect 11 12 colorectal cancer in its early stages. The legislature also finds that a screening program will 13 increase detections of any cancer at an early state, which in 14 turn improves chances for survival and decreases mortality 15 rates. - 10 SECTION 2. (a) There is established the Hawaii colorectal

- 13 human services, to facilitate the early detection of colorectal
- 14 cancer and to assist individuals who have been diagnosed with
- 15 colorectal cancer.

- 18 (1) Educate, train, and improve the skills of health care
- 19 professionals, including allied health professionals
- and lay health educators, in the detection and
