A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the current
 population of Hawaii is approximately 1,300,000 people and that
 between eighty and ninety per cent of the food consumed in the
- 4 State is imported. The legislature also finds that the majority
- 5 of all of the State's petro-chemical fertilizers, pesticides,
- ${f 6}$ and herbicides are imported. The costs associated with the
- 7 State's dependency on imported goods contributes to the high
- $oldsymbol{8}$ costs of food production and can also affect the quality and
- 9 crop of the soil in the State.
- 10 Agricultural production that relies on local, organic,
- 11 biodynamic, and bio diverse methods, such as the Korean natural
- 12 farming method, provides a viable alternative that should be
- 13 considered and encouraged in the State. However, the
- 14 legislature finds that there is a general lack of knowledge
- 15 within the farming community about these alternative methods.
- 16 Consequently, it would be desirable to establish a statewide and
- 17 island-specific farm mentoring program to teach farmers locally
- 18 sourced, organic, biodynamic, and bio diverse farming techniques SB LRB 14-0140.doc



- 1 that rely on integrated farming practices using vegetative and 2 animal waste products, instead of relying on imported 3 fertilizers, pesticides, and herbicides. 4 The purpose of this Act is to establish a statewide and 5 island-specific farming technique mentor program. There is established within the department 6 SECTION 2. (a) 7 of agriculture the farming technique mentor program. The 8 primary goal of this program is to provide grants to educate 9 farmers and farming organizations in the State regarding new and 10 innovative farming techniques that encourage the reliance on locally sourced inputs. The curriculum of the farming technique 11 12 mentor program shall include but not be limited to instruction 13 relating to: Using locally sourced organic, biodynamic, and bio 14 (1)diverse agricultural amendments and techniques that 15 rely on integrated farming practices that use 16 17 vegetative and animal waste products and diverse 18 crops; Culturing indigenous microorganism; 19 (2) Recycling nutrients back into the ground of the farm; 20 (3) 21 Managing, harvesting, and marketing crops; (4)22 (5) Using integrated pest management; and

1	(6)	Breeding and releasing beneficial insects.
2	(b)	The department of agriculture shall:
3	(1)	Establish at least one farming technique mentor
4		program for each island; provided that the islands of
5		Kahoolawe, Niihau, and Lanai are not required to have
6		a program;
7	(2)	Establish a farming technique mentor grant program
8	*,	that provides grants, of up to \$50,000 each, to
9		individual farmers and farming organizations
10		participating in the program; and
11	(3)	Allocate funds appropriated to the farming technique
12		mentor program, provided that funds be allocated to
13		each island based upon requests for proposals to pay
14		reasonable and necessary expenses for participation of
15		the program.
16	(c)	The following types of farms shall have preference for
17	grant app	roval:
18	(1)	Existing farms that use a minimum of seventy-five per
19		cent of local resources for agricultural production;
20		and
21	(2)	Existing farms that are certified to teach Korean
22		natural farming techniques.

1	(d) All funds appropriated for the farming technique
2	mentor program shall be deposited in a separate account of the
3	general fund under the control of the department of agriculture
4	and shall only be used for the purposes of this Act.
5	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
6	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$250,000 or so much
7	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 for the
8	purpose of establishing the farming technique mentor program and
9	providing monetary grants issued pursuant to section 2; provided
10	that the funds appropriated by this Act may also be used for
11	farm tools, materials, equipment, insurance, licensing, legal
12	services, and accounting costs.
13	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
14	agriculture for the purposes of this Act.
15	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2014.
