A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CULTURAL EXCHANGES BETWEEN HAWAII AND PUERTO RICO.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that since the arrival of 2 the first Puerto Ricans in Hawaii on December 23, 1900, the 3 Puerto Rican people have contributed significantly to all phases 4 of Hawaii's development. The rich culture and proud heritage of 5 the Puerto Rican people have been and continue to be positive 6 influences upon life in Hawaii. Recognition of the 7 contributions of the Puerto Rican people and their culture is 8 important to promotion and awareness of Hawaii's diverse and 9 multicultural society.

10 The purpose of this Act is to establish a Puerto Rican 11 exchange commission to coordinate a cultural exchange program 12 between Hawaii and Puerto Rico to honor and recognize the 13 contributions of the Puerto Rican people and commemorate the 14 arrival of the Puerto Ricans to Hawaii.

15 SECTION 2. (a) There is established a temporary 16 commission to be known as the Puerto Rican exchange commission 17 that shall coordinate cultural exchange events between Hawaii 18 and Puerto Rico to honor and recognize the contributions of the 2014-0390 SB SMA.doc

14	(3)	One member shall be from the Puerto Rican Association

16	(4)	One member shall be from the Kohala Puerto Rican
17		Association;
18	(5)	One member shall be from the Kauai Puerto Rican

20	(6)	Ten members shall represent government, labor,
21		business, culture and the arts, and the community at

The chair of the commission shall be selected by the 1 (b) 2 commission members. 3 (c) The members shall not receive compensation for their 4 services but shall be reimbursed for necessary expenses, 5 including travel expenses, incurred in the performance of their 6 duties under this Act. 7 SECTION 4. (a) The Puerto Rican exchange commission shall: 8 9 (1)Develop, plan, and coordinate various cultural 10 exchange programs including but not limited to the 11 following, between Hawaii and Puerto Rico and activities, that honor and recognize the contributions 12 of the Puerto Rican people to the State: 13 14 (A) Workshops teaching Hawaiian dance and lei making; Music performances; and 15 (B) 16 (C) Art presentations; 17 (2) Encourage the participation of all segments of the 18 Puerto Rican community in the exchange program; Consider any related plans and programs developed by 19 (3) the Puerto Rican Heritage Society, the United Puerto 20 21 Rican Association of Hawaii, Inc., the Puerto Rican 22 Association of Maui, the Kohala Puerto Rican 2014-0390 SB SMA.doc

Association, the Kauai Puerto Rican Association, and 1 2 other interested private and public organizations or agencies from whose members the commission may 3 4 designate special committees to plan, develop, and 5 coordinate specific projects or activities; and Design and construct a monument to commemorate the 6 (4) 7 arrival of the first Puerto Rican people to Hawaii 8 that shall be donated to Puerto Rico and be placed at 9 a location that best represents where the first Puerto 10 Ricans began their journey to Hawaii. Prior to the convening of the regular session of 2015, 11 (b) 12 the commission shall submit to the governor a comprehensive 13 report for the cultural exchange program that shall include but 14 not be limited to: 15 The production, publication, and distribution of (1)16 educational materials about the Hawaiian culture; 17 (2) Traveling exhibits, other exhibits, ceremonies, theatrical productions, and other special events 18

1 (c) At the end of its term, the commission shall submit to 2 the governor a final report of all its activities, including an 3 accounting of all moneys received and disbursed. 4 SECTION 5. All property acquired by the commission shall 5 be deposited for preservation in the Hawaii state public library 6 system, museums, or public archives. 7 SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the general 8 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so 9 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 for 10 developing, planning, and coordinating various programs and 11 events as part of a cultural exchange program with Puerto Rico 12 and construction of a monument to commemorate the arrival of the first Puerto Rican people to Hawaii. 13 14 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the office of the

16 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2014.
