RELATING TO THE HOSPITAL SUSTAINABILITY PROGRAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

The inpatient hospital sustainability fee shall be 2.365 per cent of net inpatient hospital service 7 8 revenue. The outpatient hospital sustainability fee shall be 9 three per cent of net outpatient hospital service revenue. Description:

Amends Act 217, Session Laws of Hawaii 2012, as amended by Act 141, Session Laws of Hawaii 2013, to continue the Hospital Sustainability Program by extending the sunset date of the Act, updating the referral dates in the statute, and to revise the funding amount for the hospital sustainability program for fiscal year 2014-2015. Exempts the hospital sustainability program special fund from central service expenses assessed under section 36-27, Hawaii Revised Statutes. (SD1)
