### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE NURSING FACILITY SUSTAINABILITY PROGRAM.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	TION 1. Act 156, Session Laws of Hawaii 2012, section
2	2, as ame	ended by section 2 of Act 142, Session Laws of Hawaii
3	2013, is	amended as follows:

10	with the	following objectives:
11	(1)	The rate enhancement shall be used exclusively for
12		increasing reimbursements to private nursing

15		Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services;

19	(3)	The department or any other state agency uses the

- 9 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 10 human services for the purposes of this Act.

- 13 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on June 30, 2050;

- when section 36-30, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- reenacted on June 30, 2015, pursuant to section 34 of

- 21 December 31, 2015, and section 36-30, Hawaii Revised
