### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 286, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to read as follows: 3 4 Operation of all-terrain vehicles; safety helmet. 5 (a) No person under the age of twenty-one shall operate, ride, or otherwise be propelled on an all-terrain vehicle unless the 6 7 person wears a safety helmet. 8 (b) Each person engaged in the business of leasing or 9 renting an all-terrain vehicle shall furnish a safety helmet to **10** each lessee or renter under the age of twenty-one who will 11 operate or ride in the all-terrain vehicle. 12 (c) A person who violates this section shall be subject to 13 penalties under section 286-82." Section 286-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 14 SECTION 2. amended by adding two new definitions to be appropriately

9	(b)	No person less than [eighteen] twenty-one years of age			
10	shall operate or ride as a passenger on a motorcycle or motor				
11	scooter on any highway in the State unless the person wears a				
12	safety helmet securely fastened with a helmet or chin strap."				
13	SECTION 4. Section 291C-152, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is				
14	amended to read as follows:				
15	"[+]§291C-152[+] Riding on motorcycles. (a) A person				
16	operating a motorcycle shall ride only upon the permanent and				
17	regular seat attached thereto, and such operator shall not carry				
18	any other person nor shall any other person ride on a motorcycl				
19	unless the motorcycle is designed to carry more than one person				
20	in which event a passenger may ride upon the permanent and				
21	regular seat if designed for two persons, or upon another seat				

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- 1 firmly attached to the motorcycle at the rear or side of the
- 2 operator.
- 3 (b) A person shall ride upon a motorcycle only while
- 4 sitting astride the seat, facing forward, with one leg on each
- 5 side of the motorcycle.
- 6 (c) No person shall operate a motorcycle while carrying
- 7 any package, bundle, or other article which prevents the person
- 8 from keeping both hands on the handlebars.
- 9 (d) No operator shall carry any person, nor shall any
- 10 person ride, in a position that will interfere with the
- 11 operation or control of the motorcycle or the view of the
- 12 operator.
- (e) No person under the age of twenty-one shall operate a
- 14 motorcycle or ride as a passenger on a motorcycle upon any
- 15 highway of the State, unless that person is wearing a safety
- 16 helmet pursuant to section 286-81."
- 17 SECTION 5. Section 291C-195, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 18 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
- 19 "(a) No person less than fifteen years of age shall drive
- 20 a moped on a highway, street, roadway, or any other public
- 21 property in the State. No person less than [eighteen] twenty-
- 22 one years of age shall drive a moped or ride on a moped as a



- 1 passenger unless the person wears a safety helmet [securely
- 2 fastened with a chin strap. The safety helmet shall meet the
- 3 specifications and requirements established by rules adopted by
- 4 the director.], as defined in section 286-2."
- 5 SECTION 6. Section 291C-201, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 "[+] §291C-201[+] Renting or selling mopeds. (a) Every
- 8 person engaged in the retail business of selling or renting
- 9 mopeds shall provide the person renting or purchasing a moped
- 10 with a copy of the rules for mopeds as approved by the director
- 11 of transportation.
- 12 (b) Every person renting a moped to another shall keep a
- 13 record for two years of the registration number of the moped so
- 14 rented, the name and address of the person to whom the moped is
- 15 rented, the number of the driver's license of the latter person,
- 16 and the date and place when and where the driver's license was
- 17 issued. This record shall be open to inspection by any police
- 18 officer or the examiner of drivers or the examiner of drivers'
- 19 representative.
- 20 (c) Each person engaging in the business of renting a
- 21 moped shall furnish a safety helmet, as defined in section

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- 1 286-2, to each renter under the age of twenty-one who will drive
- 2 or ride on the moped."
- 3 SECTION 7. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 4 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 5 begun before its effective date.
- 6 SECTION 8. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 7 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 8 SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

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#### Report Title:

Helmets; All-terrain Vehicles; Motorcycles; Mopeds; Motor Scooters

#### Description:

Requires helmet use for individuals under the age of twenty-one who are operating or riding motorcycles, motor scooters, mopeds, and all-terrain vehicles. Requires persons engaging in the business of renting motorcycles, motor scooters, mopeds, and all-terrain vehicles to furnish a safety helmet to renters under the age of twenty-one who will drive or ride on these vehicles.
