

A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO COMPUTER DAMAGE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Chapter 708, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 3 and to read as follows:
- 4 "§708- Computer damage in the third degree. (1) A
- 5 person commits the offense of computer damage in the third
- 6 degree if the person knowingly accesses a computer, computer
- 7 system, or computer network without authorization and thereby
- 8 recklessly causes damage.
- 9 (2) Computer damage in the third degree is a class C
- 10 felony."
- 11 SECTION 2. Section 708-890, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 12 amended by adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted
- 13 and to read as follows:
- ""Critical infrastructure computer" means a computer,
- 15 computer network, or computer system that manages or controls
- 16 systems or assets vital to national defense, national security,
- 17 national economic security, public health or safety, or any
- 18 combination of these matters, whether publicly or privately

Honolulu Prosecutor's Package; Computer Damage

Description:

Redefines the offense of computer damage in the first degree as intentionally causing or attempting to cause damage to a critical infrastructure computer and increases it to a class A felony; defines "critical infrastructure computer". Redefines the offense of computer damage in the second degree. Creates a new offense of computer damage in the third degree.
