BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

10	felony."
11	SECTION 2. Section 708-890, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
12	amended by adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted
13	and to read as follows:
14	""Critical infrastructure" means publically or privately
15	owned or operated systems or assets vital to the defense,
16	security, economic security, public health or safety, or any
17	combination thereof, of the State or nation. "Critical
