A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO ENERGY RESOURCES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that independence from
2	fossil fuels is critical for the security and well-being of
3	Hawaii's residents and for the sustainability and vitality of
4	Hawaii's economy. Rising oil costs and increased dependence on
5	foreign oil continue to place Hawaii's families and businesses
6	in a vulnerable position. Also, continued consumption of fossil
7	fuel will worsen global warming, resulting in the increasing
8	frequency and intensity of storms and rising sea levels in
9	Hawaii. This will cause significant and costly impacts to our
10	island communities as well as to the larger world.
11	The legislature also finds that the installation of solar
12	water heaters on new single-family and duplex homes is one of
13	the most cost-effective and efficient ways to remove Hawaii's
14	families' dependence on fossil fuels. A conventional electric
15	water tank accounts for thirty to thirty-five per cent of a
16	household's electric bill. It is estimated that by relying on
17	the sun for ninety per cent of its hot water demand, a family
18	could save enough money to pay for the solar system in three to

- 1 five years. After the system is paid off, the heating of water
- 2 is essentially free. In addition to federal tax credits, when
- 3 the cost of a solar water heater is included in the cost of a
- 4 mortgage there could also be the added value of tax deductions.
- 5 For the reasons above, the legislature in 2008 passed Act
- 6 204, Session Laws of Hawaii 2008, requiring solar water heaters
- 7 on new single-family homes. However, the legislature finds that
- 8 Act 204 allows variances, such as for tankless gas water
- 9 heaters, under vague and unjustified circumstances such that the
- 10 purpose of Act 204 is being thwarted in many instances.
- 11 Therefore, the legislature finds it is necessary to modify the
- 12 wording of the law and clarify that the variance allowing
- 13 tankless gas water heaters shall require application only by the
- 14 buyer of the dwelling unit. If the buyer is not available, then
- 15 the variance application shall not be accepted for processing
- 16 and the variance shall not be available.
- 17 SECTION 2. Section 196-6.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 18 amended to read as follows:
- 19 "§196-6.5 Solar water heater system required for new
- 20 single-family residential construction. (a) On or after
- 21 January 1, 2010, no building permit shall be issued for a new
- 22 single-family or duplex dwelling that does not include a solar

3	provides	hot water only as it is needed shall only be accepted	
4	<u>if:</u>		
5	(1)	The water heater has been approved by Underwriters	
6		Laboratories, Inc.;	
7	(2)	The applicant signs an affidavit that the applicant	
8		has read a flyer issued by the department of business,	
9		economic development, and tourism showing the life	
10		cycle cost comparisons of a solar water heater and a	
11		gas-tankless instantaneous water heater of equivalent	
12		capacities; and	
13	(3)	The applicant is the buyer of the new dwelling.	
14	[-(b) -] (c) A request for a variance shall be submitted to	
15	the coord	inator on an application prescribed by the coordinator	
16	and shall include a description of the location of the property		
17	and justification for the approval of a variance using the		
18	criteria	established in subsection (a). A variance shall be	
19	deemed ap	proved if not denied within thirty working days after	
20	receipt o	f the variance application. The coordinator shall	
21	publicize	·:	

1	(1) All	l applications for a variance within seven days
2	aft	ter receipt of the variance application; and
3	(2) The	e disposition of all applications for a variance
4	wit	thin seven days of the determination of the variance
5	apı	olication.

8	collect fees	to cover the costs of administering variances under

10	energy securi	ity special fund established under section 201-12.8.
11	[(d)] <u>(e</u>	e) Nothing in this section shall preclude any
12	county from e	establishing procedures and standards required to
13	implement thi	is section.
14	[(e)] <u>(</u> 1	E) Nothing in this section shall preclude
15	participation	n in any utility demand-side management program or
16	public benefi	its fee program under part VII of chapter 269."

18	and stricken	. New statutory material is underscored.
19	SECTION	4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
