BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 26-34, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
- [The] Unless otherwise provided by this chapter or by 3 "(a)
- 4 law hereafter enacted, the members of each board and commission
- 5 established by law shall be nominated and, by and with the
- advice and consent of the senate, appointed by the governor. 6
- 7 Unless otherwise provided by this chapter or by law hereafter
- 8 enacted, the terms of the members shall be for four years;
- 9 provided that the governor may reduce the terms of those
- initially appointed so as to provide, as nearly as can be, for 10
- 11 the expiration of an equal number of terms at intervals of one
- 12 year for each board and commission. Unless otherwise provided
- 13 by law, each term shall commence on July 1 and expire on
- 14 June 30, except that the terms of the chairpersons of the board
- 15 of agriculture, the board of land and natural resources, and the
- Hawaiian homes commission shall commence on January 1 and expire 16
- on December 31. [No] Unless otherwise provided by this chapter 17
- 18 or by law hereafter enacted, no person shall be appointed
