A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE STATE BUILDING CODE COUNCIL.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Act 82, Session Laws
- 2 of Hawaii 2007, established the adoption of a uniform set of
- 3 statewide building codes to apply consistent standards. Act 82
- 4 also established a state building code council.
- 5 The legislature finds, however, that unlike more than half
- 6 of the states that have a building code council, Hawaii's
- 7 building code council does not have any representatives from the
- 8 construction industry and building trades. In the state of
- 9 Washington, for example, out of a total of fifteen voting
- 10 members, four council members represent commercial and
- 11 residential builders, suppliers, and the construction trades.
- 12 The International Code Council states that at least twenty-five
- 13 state building code councils include a home builder
- 14 representative.
- 15 The purpose of this Act is to reconfigure the membership of
- 16 the state building code council to increase construction
- 17 industry and building trade representation on the state building

Any recommended state 16 amendments shall require the unanimous agreement of the 17 subcommittee. 18 The council may appoint other investigative, technical 19 expertise committees, which may include council members.

[(d) The council shall consult with general building

contractor associations and building trade associations to

- 3 (e) (d) The council shall review and adopt, as
- 4 appropriate, new model building codes within eighteen months of

- 7 references, equipment and supplies, and other operating
- 8 expenses, and may contract for the conduct of research studies
- 9 and other technical services.

- 11 technical training and administrative assistance in the form of
- 12 services or grants at the state and county levels relating to
- 13 the implementation and enforcement of the state building code
- 14 adopted pursuant to this part."
- 15 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
- 16 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
- 17 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2013-2014 to
- 18 support the state building code council's efforts to adopt a
- 19 uniform set of statewide building codes and consistent
- 20 standards.
- The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 22 accounting and general services for the purposes of this Act.

Reconfigures the membership of the state building code council by eliminating members from the department of health and department of labor and industrial relations, and adding members from the Building Industry Association; General Contractors Association; Hawaii Construction Alliance; Subcontractors' Association of Hawaii; department of business, economic development, and tourism; department of accounting and general services; Hawaii Building and Construction Trades Council; and American Council of Engineering Companies. Changes the requirements for a quorum from six to seven. Eliminates the council's obligation to consult with private sector representatives regarding construction practices and training. Makes an appropriation. (SD1)
