A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FAILURE TO REPORT A MISSING CHILD.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 3. Chapter 709, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 2 3 and to read as follows: Failure to report the death of a child. (1) A 4 "§709caregiver commits the offense of failure to report the death of 5 6 a child if a caregiver fails to report the death of a child who 7 was under the caregiver's custody to a law enforcement agency 8 within two hours of the discovery of the child's death. 9 (2) "Caregiver" means a parent, legal guardian, or other 10 person legally charged with the care or custody of a child. 11 "Child" means a person under the age of eighteen 12 years. 13 (4) Failure to report the death of a child is a class C 14 felony." SECTION 4. Chapter 709, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 15 16 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 17 and to read as follows: 18 False information to law enforcement regarding a "§709-19 missing child. - 4 (2) "Caregiver" means a parent, legal guardian, or other
- 5 person legally charged with the care or custody of a child.
- 6 (3) "Child" means a person under the age of eighteen
- 7 years.
- **8** (4) False information to law enforcement regarding a
- 9 missing child is a class C felony."
- 10 SECTION 5. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 11 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 12 begun before its effective date.
- 13 SECTION 6. If any provision of this Act, or the
- 14 application thereof to any person or circumstance, is held
- 15 invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or
- 16 applications of the Act that can be given effect without the
- 17 invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions
- 18 of this Act are severable.
- 19 SECTION 7. New statutory material is underscored.
- 20 SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Report Title:

Felony; Report Death or Disappearance of Child; False Report; Missing Child

Description:

Establishes that it is a class C felony for caregivers to fail to report the death or disappearance of a child to law enforcement or to provide false information to law enforcement authorities about a missing child. (SD1)
