A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO TANNING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. The legislature finds that many physicians and scientists now warn that the health risks associated with suntanning are greater when tanning with artificial ultraviolet
- 4 light. Specifically, those health risks include sunburn,
- 5 premature aging, skin cancer, retinal damage, formation of
- 6 cataracts, suppression of the immune system, and damage to the
- 7 vascular system. The legislature further finds that certain
- $oldsymbol{8}$ medications, cosmetics, and foods are "photosensitizing," which
- $oldsymbol{9}$ means that they react unfavorably with ultraviolet light in some
- 10 people, resulting in skin rashes or burns. Sunlamps and other
- 11 artificial sources of ultraviolet light are known to intensify
- 12 these effects.
- 13 The legislature also finds that statutory regulation is
- 14 necessary to protect and promote public health, safety, and
- 15 welfare concerning tanning with artificial ultraviolet light,
- 16 especially where minors are concerned.
- 17 The purpose of this Act is to:

1	(1)	Make it unlawful for tanning facilities and operators
2		in the State to allow the use of tanning equipment by
3		anyone under the age of eighteen; and
4	(2)	Require all tanning facilities and operators in the
5		State to provide written notice and post warning signs
6		regarding health and safety risks associated with
7		ultraviolet light; and meet certain requirements
8		relating to the safe operation of tanning equipment.
9	SECT	ION 2. Chapter 321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
10	amended b	y adding a new section to be appropriately designated
11	and to re	ad as follows:
12	" <u>§32</u>	1- Tanning facilities; minors; notice;
13	requireme	nts; penalties. (a) This section shall apply to any
14	tanning f	acility in Hawaii; provided that it shall not apply to
15	any physi	cian duly licensed to practice medicine under chapter
16	453 who u	ses, in the practice of medicine, medical diagnostic
17	and thera	peutic equipment that emit ultraviolet radiation or to
18	any perso	n who owns tanning equipment exclusively for personal,
19	noncommer	cial use.
20	(b)	It shall be unlawful for a tanning facility or
21	operator	to allow any person under the age of eighteen years to

use any tanning equipment.

1	(c)	Each tanning facility in the State shall provide each
2	of its cu	stomers written notice before initial use of any
3	tanning e	quipment and at the beginning of each succeeding
4	calendar	year. The form of the written notice shall be
5	substanti	ally as follows:
6	(1)	Failure to wear eye protection provided by the tanning
7		facility may damage the customer's eyes and cause
8		<pre>cataracts;</pre>
9	(2)	Overexposure to ultraviolet light from tanning
10		equipment may cause burns to the skin;
11	<u>(3)</u>	Repeated exposure to ultraviolet light from tanning
12		equipment may cause premature aging of the skin and
13		<pre>skin cancer;</pre>
14	(4)	Abnormal skin sensitivity or burning of the skin while
15		using tanning equipment may be caused by certain
16		foods; certain cosmetics; or certain medications,
17		including tranquilizers, diuretics, antibiotics, high
18	·	blood pressure medicines, and birth control pills; and
19	(5)	Any person who takes medication should consult a
20		physician before using tanning equipment.
21	(d)	Each tanning facility in the State shall prominently
22	display a	warning sign in each area where tanning equipment is

1	used. Th	e form of the warning sign shall be substantially as
2	follows:	
3	(1)	Follow instructions;
4	(2)	Avoid too frequent or too lengthy exposure. Like
5		exposure to the sun, use of tanning equipment can
6		cause eye and skin injury and allergic reactions.
7		Repeated exposure can cause chronic sun damage, which
8		is characterized by wrinkling, dryness, fragility and
9		bruising of the skin, and skin cancer;
10	<u>(3)</u>	Wear protective eyewear. Failure to do so may result
11		in severe burns or long-term injury to the eyes;
12	(4)	Medications and cosmetics may increase your
13		sensitivity to ultraviolet radiation. Consult a
14		physician before using tanning equipment if you are
15		especially sensitive to sunlight; and
16	<u>(5)</u>	If your skin does not tan when exposed to the sun, it
17		is unlikely that your skin will tan when exposed to
18		ultraviolet light produced by this tanning equipment.
19	<u>(e)</u>	The owner, lessee, or operator of a tanning facility
20	shall ens	ure that all of the following requirements are met:
21	(1)	No customer under eighteen years of age shall be
22		permitted to use the tanning facility. Proof of age

1		shall be satisfied with a government-issued photo
2		identification document containing the date of birth
3		of the customer;
4	(2)	A trained operator, who is able to inform customers
5		about and assist customers in the proper use of
6		tanning equipment, shall be present at the tanning
7		facility during operating hours;
8	(3)	Each tanning bed is properly sanitized after each use;
9	(4)	Prior to using tanning equipment, each customer shall
10		be provided with properly sanitized and securely-
11		fitted protective eyewear that protects the wearer's
12		eyes from ultraviolet radiation and allows enough
13		vision to maintain balance;
14	<u>(5)</u>	A customer shall not be permitted to use tanning
15		equipment unless the customer uses protective eyewear;
16	<u>(6)</u>	Each customer shall be shown how to use physical aids,
17		such as handrails and floor markings, to maintain
18		proper exposure distance from tanning equipment, as
19		recommended by the manufacturer;
20	(7)	A timing device that is accurate within ten per cent
21		of any selected timer interval shall control tanning

1		equipment and shall be remotely located so customers
2		cannot set their own exposure time;
3	(8)	All tanning equipment shall be equipped with a
4		mechanism that allows the customer to turn the tanning
5		equipment off;
6	(9)	Each customer shall be limited to the maximum exposure
7		time recommended by the manufacturer for that
8		customer's skin type;
9	(10)	Customers shall not use any tanning equipment more
10		than once every twenty-four hours;
11	(11)	The interior temperature of a tanning bed shall not
12		exceed one hundred degrees Fahrenheit; and
13	(12)	Signed customer statements, as required by subsection
14		(f), shall be retained for three years or until the
15		customer signs a new statement.
16	<u>(f)</u>	No person shall use the tanning equipment of a tanning
17	facility	unless the following requirements are met:
18	(1)	Before the initial use of any tanning equipment and at
19		the beginning of each succeeding calendar year, a
20		customer shall sign a statement acknowledging that the
21		customer has read and understands the written notice
22		required by subsection (c) and the warning sign

1		required by subsection (d) and agrees to use
2		protective eyewear; and
3	(2)	A customer agrees to use protective eyewear at all
4		times while using tanning equipment.
5	(g)	The director of health may impose a fine upon any
6	operator	of a tanning facility who violates this section. A
7	fine shal	l not exceed:
8	(1)	\$ for a first violation; and
9	(2)	\$ for each subsequent violation.
10	<u>(h)</u>	The director of health may adopt rules in accordance
11	with chap	ter 91 to implement this section.
12	<u>(i)</u>	As used in this section:
13	"Ope	rator" means a person designated by the tanning
14	facility	owner or tanning equipment lessee to operate or to
15	assist an	d instruct in the operation and use of the tanning
16	facility	or tanning equipment.
17	<u>"</u> Tan	ning bed" means a structure in which an individual
18	stands or	reclines for the purpose of tanning the skin by
19	exposing	it to sunlamps.
20	<u>"Tan</u>	ning equipment" means any device that emits
21	electroma	gnetic radiation with wavelengths in the air between

- 1 200 and 400 nanometers used for tanning of the skin, including
- 2 but not limited to sunlamps, tanning booths, or tanning beds.
- 3 "Tanning facility" means any location, place, area,
- 4 structure, or business that provides persons access to any
- 5 tanning equipment, including tanning salons, health clubs, gyms,
- 6 apartments, condominiums, and hotels, regardless of whether a
- 7 fee is charged for access to the tanning equipment."
- 8 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
- 9 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.

Makes it unlawful for tanning facilities and operators to allow use of tanning equipment by anyone under the age of eighteen. Requires all tanning facilities and operators to provide written notice, post warning signs, and meet certain requirements relating to the safe operation of tanning equipment. Effective 07/01/2050.
