A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CRIME.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Section 708-872, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

4	commits t	he offense of falsifying business records if, with
5	intent to	defraud, the person:
6	(a)	Makes or causes a false entry in the business records
7		of an enterprise; or
8	(b)	Alters, erases, obliterates, deletes, removes, or
9		destroys a true entry in the business records of an
10		enterprise; or
11	(c)	Omits to make a true entry in the business records of
12		an enterprise in violation of a duty to do so which
13		the person knows to be imposed upon the person by law,
14		other than for the information of the government, or
15		by the nature of the person's position; or
16	(d)	Prevents the making of a true entry or causes the
17		omission thereof in the business records of an
18		enterprise.

1 (2) ["Enterprise" means any entity of one or more persons, 2 corporate or otherwise, engaged in business, commercial, professional, industrial, eleemosynary, or social activity. For 3 4 the purposes of this section: 5 [(3)] "Business record" means any [writing or article] 6 record kept or maintained by an enterprise for the purpose of evidencing or reflecting its condition or activity. 7 8 "Electronic" means relating to technology having 9 electrical, digital, magnetic, wireless, optical, 10 electromagnetic, or similar capabilities. 11 "Enterprise" means any entity of one or more persons, 12 corporate or otherwise, engaged in business, commercial, 13 professional, industrial, eleemosynary, or social activity. 14 "Information" means data, text, images, sounds, codes, 15 computer programs, software, databases, or the like. 16 "Record" means information that is written or printed, or that is stored in an electronic or other medium and is 17 retrievable in a perceivable form. 18 19 $[\frac{4}{4}]$ (3) Falsifying business records is a misdemeanor." SECTION 2. Section 710-1000, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 20 21 amended by adding six new definitions to be appropriately 22 inserted and to read as follows:

1 ""Electronic" means relating to technology having 2 electrical, digital, magnetic, wireless, optical, 3 electromagnetic, or similar capabilities. "Falsely alter" means to change, without the authority of 4 the ostensible maker or authorized custodian of the record, a 5 statement, document, or record, whether complete or incomplete, 6 7 by means of erasure, obliteration, deletion, insertion of new matter, transposition of matter, or in any other manner, so that 8 9 the statement, document, or record so altered falsely appears or 10 purports to be in all respects an authentic creation of its 11 ostensible maker, or authorized by the maker or custodian of the record. 12 "Falsely complete" means to transform, by adding, 13 14 inserting, or changing matter, an incomplete statement, document, or record into a complete one, without the authority 15 of the ostensible maker or authorized custodian of the record, 16 so that the complete statement, document, or record falsely 17 18 appears or purports to be in all respects an authentic creation of its ostensible maker, or authorized by the maker or custodian 19 20 of the record. 21 "Falsely make" means to create a statement, document, or 22 record, which purports to be an authentic creation of its

1	(d) Knowing the person lacks the authority to do so:
2	(i) The person intentionally destroys, mutilates,
3	conceals, removes, or otherwise impairs the
4	availability of any government records; or
5	(ii) The person refuses to deliver up a government
6	record in the person's possession upon proper
7	request of a public servant entitled to receive
8	such record for examination or other purposes.
9	(2) For the purpose of this section, "government record"
10	[includes all official books, papers, written instruments, or]
11	means all records created, issued, received, or kept by any
12	governmental office or agency or required by law to be kept by
13	others for the information of the government."
