A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO WAGES AND HOURS ON PUBLIC WORKS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

12	W	ork of a governmental contracting agency for a period
13	0	f [three] five years except as provided in section
14	1	04-25(a)(2). "New work on any public work" includes
15	a	ny public works project in which the suspended person
16	0	r firm has not begun work at the job site as of the
17	đ	ate of the suspension order. The suspension shall be
18	e	ffective on the later of the twenty-first day after

1		the sending of the notification or violation, or
2		issuance of a decision pursuant to section 104-23(c).
3	(d)	A first, second, or third violation refers to each
4	[project]	investigation involving one or more projects in which
5	the depart	tment finds that a contractor has failed to comply with
6	this chapt	ter."
7	SECT	ION 2. Section 104-25, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
8	amended by	y amending subsections (a) and (b) to read as follows:
9	"(a)	The director shall suspend a person or firm as
10	follows:	
11	(1)	For a first or second violation, if a person or firm
12		fails to pay wages found due, any penalty assessed, or
13		both, the person or firm shall be immediately
14		suspended from doing any work on any public work of a
15		governmental contracting agency until all wages and
16		penalties are paid in full;
17	(2)	For a third violation, the suspension shall be as
18		prescribed in section 104-24(c); provided that, if the
19		person or firm continues to violate this chapter or
20		fails to pay wages found due or any penalty assessed,
21		or both, then the contractor shall immediately be
22		suspended from doing any work on any public work of a

1		governmental contracting agency for a mandatory	
2		[three-year] five-year period. If after the [three-	
3		year] five-year suspension period the wages found due	
4		or penalties assessed are still unpaid, the suspension	
5		shall remain in force until payment is made in full;	
6		or	
7	(3)	For falsification of records, or for delay or	
8		interference with an investigation pursuant to section	
9		104-22, the contractor shall be immediately suspended	
10		for a period of [three] five years.	
11	(b)	The director shall immediately notify the governmental	
12	contracti	ng agency, comptroller [and], the auditor or director	
13	of financ	e of the county, and, in the case of a suspended	
14	subcontra	actor, the general contractor of any suspension order."	
15	SECT	TION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that	
16	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that wer		
17	begun before its effective date.		
18	SECTION 4. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed		
19	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.		
20	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050;		
21	provided that on June 30, 2018, this Act shall be repealed and		
22	sections 104-24 and 104-25, Hawaii Revised Statutes, shall be		
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- 1 reenacted in the form in which they read on the day prior to the
- 2 effective date of this Act.

Report Title:

Public Works; Prevailing Wage; Penalties; Suspension

Description:

Increases the suspension period from three to five years for a third violation of a person or firm who violates state law on wages and hours of employees on public works. Clarifies the effective date of suspension. Clarifies that a first, second, or third violation refers to each investigation involving one or more projects, rather than each project, in which a contractor has failed to comply. Specifies that suspension for falsification of records or delay or interference with an investigation is immediate. Specifies who the director of labor and industrial relations must notify of any suspension order. Repeals 06/30/2018. Effective 07/01/2050. (SD2)

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
