### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Act 178, Session Laws of Hawaii 2012, is 2 amended by amending section 3 to read as follows: 3 "SECTION 3. Section 302A-411, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended to read as follows: 4 "§302A-411 Kindergarten program; establishment; 5 6 attendance. (a) The department shall establish and maintain 7 kindergartens with a program of instruction as a part of the 8 public school system; provided that: 9 (1) Attendance shall not be mandatory; and Charter schools shall be excluded from mandatory (2)
- 10 11 participation in the program.
- 12 Beginning with the 2014-2015 school year, a child who (b) 13 will be at least five years of age on July 31 of the school year 14 may attend a public school kindergarten[-]; provided that a school principal may allow a child who is at least four years of 15 age on July 31 of the school year to attend kindergarten at the 16
- 17 principal's school if the principal determines that the child's
