A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that section 304A-502, 2 Hawaii Revised Statutes, authorizes the board of regents of the University of Hawaii to grant, modify, or suspend tuition 3 4 waivers. 5 The legislature further finds that the board of regents, through its internal policies, grants waivers of the nonresident 6 7 tuition differential to the following individuals: 8 (1)East-West center student grantees pursuing 9 baccalaureate or advanced degrees; (2) United States military personnel stationed in Hawaii 10 11 on active duty, and their authorized dependents during 12 the period that the personnel are stationed in Hawaii; Members of the Hawaii national guard and the Hawaii 13 (3) 14 reserves: Native Hawaiians whose domicile is outside of Hawaii; 15 (4)

1 The board of regents' current policies do not offer a 2 waiver of the nonresident tuition differential to veterans who 3 are honorably discharged from active duty within the State of 4 Hawaii or for those veterans who want to come to the State to 5 attend the University of Hawaii. 6 Since the Post 9/11 Veterans Education Assistance Act of 7 2008 went into effect, more than 1,500,000 veterans have taken 8 advantage of its benefits to cover the costs of a college 9 education. 10 The legislature finds that a number of states currently 11 have laws that waive certain residency requirements to allow veterans to attend state universities in states other than their 12 13 state of residency upon separating from the military. 14 The legislature further finds that allowing a waiver of the 15 nonresident tuition differential to veterans will expand 16 veterans' educational opportunities by allowing them to attend 17 college within the University of Hawaii system at the resident 18 tuition rate. 19 The purpose of this Act is to require the board or regents 20 to waive the nonresident tuition and fee differential for 21 veterans of the United States armed forces, who were honorably

discharged, regardless of their actual state of residence.

19	(4)	Waive entirely or reduce the tuition fee or any of the
20		other fees for students, resident or nonresident; and

1	(5) Waive the nonresident tuition and fee differential for
2	members in good standing of the following military
3	units, regardless of their actual state of residence:
4	(A) The Hawaii national guard; and
5	(B) The federal reserve components of the <u>United</u>
6	States Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps, and
7	Coast Guard who attend drills with units located
8	within the State.
9	(c) Beginning with the 2014-2015 academic year, the board
10	shall waive the nonresident tuition and fee differential for
11	veterans of the United States armed forces, who were honorably
12	discharged, regardless of their actual state of residence, and
13	who use G.I. education benefits. As used in this subsection,
14	"G.I. education benefits" means any education benefit
15	administered by the United States Department of Veterans Affairs
16	that is designed to assist eligible veterans of the United
17	States armed forces cover the costs associated with enrollment
18	as a student.
19	(d) The board shall determine the percentage of allowable
20	tuition and fee waivers for financial need and other university
21	priorities. These tuition waivers and waivers of the

- 1 nonresident tuition and fee differential shall be awarded in
- 2 accordance with guidelines established by the board."
