BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 711-1111, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended by amending subsection (1) to read as follows:

3 (1) A person commits the offense of violation of privacy
4 in the second degree if, except in the execution of a public
5 duty or as authorized by law, the person intentionally:

6 (a) Trespasses on property for the purpose of subjecting
7 anyone to eavesdropping or other surveillance in a
8 private place;

Peers or peeps into a window or other opening of a 9 (b) dwelling or other structure adapted for sojourn or 10 11 overnight accommodations for the purpose of spying on the occupant thereof or invading the privacy of 12 another person with a lewd or unlawful purpose, under 13 circumstances in which a reasonable person in the 14 15 dwelling or other structure would not expect to be 16 observed;
