A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CHILDHOOD OBESITY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that childhood obesity is
2	a serious medical condition affecting the State's children and
3	adolescents. Childhood obesity often leads to health problems
4	that were once limited to adults such as diabetes, high blood
5	pressure, and high cholesterol. According to the Centers for
6	Disease Control and Prevention, body mass index is a reliable
7	indicator of body fat.
8	The purpose of this Act is to:
9	(1) Require primary care physicians and pediatricians to
10	administer an annual body mass index measurement to
11	children, beginning at the age of two years old, and
12	report the data to the Hawaii health information
13	exchange; and
14	(2) Establish mandatory coverage for body mass indexing
15	for patients age two to eighteen.
16	SECTION 2. Chapter 321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
17	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
18	and to read as follows:

(a) All 7 individual and group hospital and medical service corporation 8 contracts shall cover annual body mass index measurements, as 9 required by section 321- , for every insured from age two to **10** eighteen years. 11 (b) The term "body mass index" shall have the same meaning as in section 321- ." 12 13 SECTION 5. Section 432D-23, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 14 amended to read as follows: "§432D-23 Required provisions and benefits. 15 16 Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, each 17 policy, contract, plan, or agreement issued in the State after 18 January 1, 1995, by health maintenance organizations pursuant to 19 this chapter, shall include benefits provided in sections 20 431:10-212, 431:10A-115, 431:10A-115.5, 431:10A-116, 431:10A-

- 5 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2014;
- 6 provided that this Act shall apply to all health plan contracts
- 7 issued or renewed in this State on or after January 1, 2015.

Child Obesity; Body Mass Index; Mandatory Coverage

Description:

Requires primary care physicians and pediatricians to provide an annual body mass index measurement to patients from age two to eighteen years. Requires primary care physicians and pediatricians to annually report anonymous age and body mass index statistics to the Hawaii health information exchange. Requires health plans to cover expenses related to body mass index measurement beginning on 1/1/2015. (SD1)
