A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO RECYCLING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 339D-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows:
3	"(c) [By June 1, 2009, and annually thereafter, each] Each
4	electronic device manufacturer shall submit a plan to the
5	department annually to establish, conduct, and manage a program
6	for the collection, transportation, and recycling of its covered
7	electronic devices sold in the State, which shall be subject to
8	the following conditions:
9	(1) Each electronic manufacturer shall provide a
10	convenient location in each county to accept
11	electronic devices for recycling that shall be open a
12	minimum of one day per week;
13	$[\frac{(1)}{(2)}]$ The plan shall not permit the charging of a fee
14	at the point of recycling if the covered electronic
15	device is brought by the covered electronic device
16	owner to a central location for recycling; provided
17	that the plan may include a reasonable transportation
18	fee if the electronic device manufacturer or
	and a condition of the desired

1	electronic device manufacturer's agent removes the
2	covered electronic device from the owner's premises at
3	the owner's request and if the removal is not in
4	conjunction with delivery of a new electronic device
5	to the owner; and
6	[(2)] <u>(3)</u> Each electronic device manufacturer may develop
7	its own recycling program or may collaborate with
8	other electronic device manufacturers, so long as the
9	program is implemented and fully operational no later
10	than January 1, [2010.] <u>2016.</u> "
11	SECTION 2. Section 339D-10, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
12	amended to read as follows:
13	"[+]\$339D-10[+] Electronic device recycling fund. (a)
14	There is established in the state treasury the electronic device
15	recycling fund into which shall be deposited all fees, payments,
16	and penalties collected by the department pursuant to this
17	chapter.
18	(b) A percentage of the annual fees collected for the
19	electronic device recycling fund shall be distributed to the
20	counties to pay for recycling electronic devices as follows:

2	City and county of Honolulu per cent.
3	[(b)] <u>(c)</u> The electronic device recycling fund shall be
4	administered by the department of health. Moneys in the fund,
5	except for moneys distributed under subsection (b), shall be
6	expended by the director solely for the purpose of implementing
7	and enforcing this chapter."
8	SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
9	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
10	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2014.
