A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO UNAUTHORIZED ENTRY INTO MOTOR VEHICLE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. 11	SECTION 2	. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
12	matured, penal	ties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
13	begun before i	ts effective date.
14	SECTION 3	. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
15	and stricken.	New statutory material is underscored.
16	SECTION 4	. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
