RELATING TO THE PHASED REVIEW OF HISTORIC PRESERVATION PROJECTS

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to clarify relevant
- 2 sections of the Hawaii Revised Statutes to conform to federal
- 3 regulations.
- 4 SECTION 2. Section 6E-8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 5 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
- 6 "(a) Before any agency or officer of the State or its
- 7 political subdivisions commences any project which may affect
- 8 historic property, aviation artifact, or a burial site, the
- 9 agency or officer shall advise the department and allow the
- 10 department an opportunity for review of the effect of the
- 11 proposed project on historic properties, aviation artifacts, or
- 12 burial sites, consistent with section 6E-43, especially those
- 13 listed on the Hawaii register of historic places. The proposed
- 14 project shall not be commenced, or if it has already begun,
- 15 continued, until the department has given its written
- 16 concurrence. If:

Report Title:

Historic Preservation; Historic Properties; Phased Review

Description:

Amends existing law to conform to federal regulations by clarifying that a phased review of a proposed project that may affect historic property is allowed if the proposed project consists of corridors or large land areas or access to properties is restricted. Repeals the allowance of phased review based solely on the existence of circumstances dictating that construction be done in stages.
