#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Act 51, Session Laws
- 2 of Hawaii 2004 (Act 51), sought to revamp education in Hawaii
- 3 by, in part, creating an interagency working group to develop
- 4 plans for transferring certain rights, powers, functions,
- 5 duties, and resources from various state departments to the
- 6 department of education. The interagency working group ceased
- 7 to exist on June 30, 2007.
- 8 The legislature further finds that re-establishing
- 9 interagency working groups will help address various issues that
- 10 have either not been fully resolved since Act 51 or have arisen
- 11 as a result of the transferring of certain rights, powers,
- 12 functions, duties, and resources from various state departments
- 13 to the department of education.
- 14 The purpose of this Act is to re-establish interagency
- 15 working groups based on Act 51.
- 16 SECTION 2. (a) The department of education shall convene
- 17 an interagency working group to discuss and create a
- 18 comprehensive plan to address issues relating to:
