
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 302A-1164, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended as follows:
- 3 1. By amending subsections (a) and (b) to read:
- 4 "(a) The department shall permit:
- 5 (1) The self-administration of medication by a student for
6 asthma, anaphylaxis, or other potentially
7 life-threatening illnesses; and
- 8 (2) Department employees and agents to volunteer to
9 administer glucagon in an emergency situation to
10 students with diabetes[-] or administer auto-
11 injectable epinephrine to students in anaphylactic
12 shock.
- 13 (b) The student's parent or guardian shall provide the
14 department with:
- 15 (1) Written authorization for the self-administration of
16 medication or the emergency administration of
17 glucagon[+] or auto-injectable epinephrine;



1 (2) In the case of self-administration of medication,
2 written certification from the student's physician or
3 physician assistant stating that the student:

4 (A) Has asthma, anaphylaxis, or another potentially
5 life-threatening illness; and

6 (B) Is capable of, and has been instructed in, the
7 proper method of self-administration of
8 medication; and

9 (3) In the case of emergency administration of glucagon to
10 a student with diabetes[-] or epinephrine to a student
11 in anaphylactic shock, written certification from the
12 student's physician or physician assistant stating
13 that the student has medical orders that glucagon or
14 epinephrine may be administered by a volunteer."

15 2. By amending subsection (g) to read:

16 "(g) Any employee or agent who volunteers to administer
17 glucagon in an emergency situation to a student with diabetes or
18 epinephrine to a student in anaphylactic shock shall receive
19 instruction in the proper administration of glucagon or
20 epinephrine, respectively, by a qualified health care
21 professional[-], as overseen by the department of health. A

22 "qualified health care professional" means a licensed physician,



1 physician assistant, advanced practice registered nurse [~~or~~],
2 registered nurse, or certified diabetes educator. The student's
3 parent or guardian shall supply the school with the glucagon kit
4 required to administer the glucagon[~~-~~] or with auto-injectable
5 epinephrine supplies to administer epinephrine. The school
6 shall store the glucagon kit or auto-injectable epinephrine
7 supplies in a secure but accessible location."

8 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
9 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$350,000 or so much
10 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 for the
11 department of education to contract with the department of
12 health for instruction, training, and related expenses required
13 for compliance with this Act.

14 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
15 education for the purposes of this Act.

16 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
17 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

18 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.



Report Title:

Education; Administration of Epinephrine; Department of Health; Appropriation

Description:

Allows department of education employees and agents to volunteer to administer epinephrine to a student in anaphylactic shock. Requires proper instruction and training to every employee or agent who volunteers to administer glucagon or epinephrine by a qualified health care professional overseen by the department of health. Requires a student's parent or guardian to provide the department of education with written authorization for epinephrine and to supply auto-injectable epinephrine supplies to administer the epinephrine. Makes an appropriation for required instruction, training, and related expenses. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD1)

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
