A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 349, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated		
3	and to read as follows:		
4	"§349- Alzheimer's disease and related dementia serv		
5	program.	(a) The executive office on aging may establish the	
6	Alzheimer	's disease and related dementia services program. The	
7	program shall be coordinated by the Alzheimer's disease and		
8	related dementia services coordinator and shall provide:		
9	(1)	A family consultant with expertise in dementia care to	
10		provide in-home needs assessment, counseling,	
11		information, and assistance with care decisions;	
12	(2)	Assistance for caregivers of individuals with	
13		Alzheimer's disease and related dementia in finding	
14		and selecting the type of respite and support services	
15		that best meets their needs;	
16	(3)	Funding assistance when available for those who	
17		qualify for support of in-home personal care, adult	

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1		day services, group respite, or overnight residential	
2		respite care for eligible families;	
3	(4)	Training and educational resources for family	
4		caregivers, respite care providers, and community	
5		organizations; and	
6	(5)	Linkage to community based agencies and the	
7		Alzheimer's Association - Aloha Chapter.	
8	(b)	Eligibility requirements for participation in the	
9	Alzheimer	's disease and related dementia services program shall	
10	include but not be limited to:		
11	(1)	Confirmation of Alzheimer's disease or other types of	
12		dementia by a caregiver, physician, or health care	
13		provider; and	
14	(2)	Proof of Hawaii residency.	
15	Caregiver	s receiving services through the executive office on	
16	aging's a	ging and disability resource center are eligible for	
17	all benef	its of the program, excluding additional respite	
18	funding.	There is no age restriction for eligibility for the	
19	person wi	th dementia or the family caregiver. While there are	
20	no specif	ic income limitations for the program, the program	
21	shall giv	e priority to low-income, rural, and minority families	

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(c) The director shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter 91 1 necessary for the purposes of this section." 2 SECTION 2. Section 349-3.2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 3 4 amended to read as follows: "[+]§349-3.2[+] Alzheimer's disease and related dementia 5 services coordinator. There is established within the executive 7 office on aging an Alzheimer's disease and related dementia 8 services coordinator to coordinate the provision of public and 9 private Alzheimer's disease and related dementia services[-], including coordinating the Alzheimer's disease and related 10 dementia services program established in section 349- . The 11 12 coordinator shall be appointed by the director in accordance 13 with chapters 76 and 89." SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 14 and stricken.
