BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Section 349-3.2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended to read as follows:	
3	"[+]§349-3.2[+] Alzheimer's disease and related dementia	
4	services	coordinator. There is established within the executive
5	office on aging an Alzheimer's disease and related dementia	
6	services coordinator to coordinate the provision of public and	
7	private Alzheimer's disease and related dementia services[-] and	
8	to coordinate and support efforts to:	
9	(1)	Prevent and treat Alzheimer's disease;
10	(2)	Enhance the quality and efficiency of Alzheimer's
11		disease care;
12	<u>(3)</u>	Expand supports for people with Alzheimer's disease
13		and their families;
14	(4)	Enhance public awareness of Alzheimer's disease and
15		its symptoms; and
16	(5)	Improve the collection and analysis of data tracking
17		efforts for the prevention and treatment of
18		Alzheimer's disease.

- 1 The coordinator shall be appointed by the director in accordance
- with chapters 76 and 89."
- 3 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
- 4 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 5 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 for the
- 6 establishment of one full-time equivalent (1.00 FTE) position in
- 7 the executive office on aging to assist the Alzheimer's disease
- 8 and related dementia services coordinator with information and
- 9 referral, counseling, education, support groups, and safety
- 10 services.
- 11 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 12 health for the purposes of this Act.
- 13 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 14 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 15 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2150.
