A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO COMMUNITY PLANNING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the careful
- 2 coordination of transit and development is critical, so that
- 3 each can optimally enhance the other. Transit-oriented
- 4 development presents an opportunity not only for "a project at a
- 5 station", but for a full-fledged transit-centered community. A
- 6 transit corridor that offers an advantageous mix of uses can be
- 7 used to integrate a number of separate activity nodes,
- 8 particularly when the various uses are close together, are
- 9 easily accessible, and support each other.
- 10 The purpose of this Act is to establish a transit-oriented
- 11 development advisory committee to make recommendations about
- 12 sustainable development projects close to transit.
- 13 SECTION 2. Chapter 206E, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 14 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 15 and to read as follows:
- 16 "\$206E- Transit-oriented development advisory committee.
- 17 (a) There is established a transit-oriented development
- 18 advisory committee within the department of business, economic

7	(4)	Consideration of the land use and zoning, as they
8		relate to infrastructure and capacity, and whether
9		they are consistent with the county's transit-oriented
10		development program;
11	<u>(5)</u>	Identification of similar development plans, such as
12		the city and county of Honolulu department of planning
13		and permitting's neighborhood transit-oriented
14		development plans;
15	(6)	Social and economic effects of the project, including:
16		(A) Expected population growth;
17		(B) Available jobs;
18		(C) Potential industries within the transit-oriented
19		development zone; and
20		(D) Potential compatibility of mix of uses for the
21		project;

6	(8)	Preservation and expansion of workforce housing around
7		transit to accommodate housing for:
8		(A) Individuals;
9		(B) Single families; and
10		(C) Senior citizens and aging in place individuals;
11		and
12	(9)	Identification and application of partnerships to
13		provide opportunities for mutual expectations and
14		shared risk and costs where:
15		(A) The public sector can provide:
16		(i) Resolution to land use and zoning issues;
17		(ii) Site development;
18		(iii) Entitlement processes; and
19		(iv) Financial resources for land and
20		infrastructure costs; and
21		(B) The private sector can provide experience and
22		financial resources.

1	(e) All members shall serve for a term of four years. Any
2	vacancies occurring in the membership of the committee shall be
3	filled for the remainder of the unexpired term in the same
4	manner as the original appointments.
5	(f) Members of the transit-oriented development advisory
6	committee shall receive no compensation but shall be reimbursed
7	for necessary expenses, including travel expenses, incurred in
8	the performance of their duties as members of the committee.
9	(g) The committee shall convene for quarterly meetings in
10	the city and county of Honolulu; provided that any member who is
11	not a state resident may attend a meeting by teleconference.
12	(h) The committee shall submit an annual report on its
13	activities to:
14	(1) The legislature and office of the governor;
15	(2) The Honolulu city council and the office of the mayor
16	of the city and county of Honolulu; and
17	(3) The board of directors of the Honolulu authority for
18	rapid transportation."
19	SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
20	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
