## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CONTINUING EDUCATION FOR PSYCHOLOGISTS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that in 1967, Hawaii
- 2 established regulation of the profession of psychology.
- 3 However, unlike other licensed professions, continuing education
- 4 credits were not required for psychologists to renew their
- 5 license. The legislature also finds that psychologists provide
- 6 critically needed services in prevention, intervention, and
- 7 treatment to a broad spectrum of clients so it is essential that
- 8 psychologists maintain their professional competency and keep
- 9 abreast of the latest developments in their profession.
- 10 The purpose of this Act is to require psychologists in the
- 11 State of Hawaii to complete a minimum of eighteen continuing
- 12 education credit hours beginning with the renewal for the
- 13 licensing biennium July 1, 2016, through June 30, 2018.
- 14 SECTION 2. Section 465-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 15 amended by adding two new definitions to be appropriately
- 16 inserted and to read as follows:
- ""Continuing education courses" means courses approved by
- 18 the American Psychological Association, the Hawaii Psychological



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    Association, or other state or provincial psychological
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    associations.
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         "Credit hours" means, except as otherwise provided, the
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    value assigned to fifty minutes of instruction."
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         SECTION 3. Section 465-11, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
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    amended to read as follows:
         "§465-11 Renewals. (a) Every license issued under this
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    chapter shall be renewed biennially on or before June 30 of each
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    even-numbered year. Failure to renew a license shall [suspend]
    forfeit the license; provided that a psychologist whose license
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    has been [suspended] forfeited for one year or less for failure
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    to renew may [reinstate] restore the license by payment of the
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    renewal fee and, in the case of a psychologist who is audited,
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    submission of documentation of continuing education compliance,
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    for the biennium in which the failure occurred[, and provided
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    that the period of suspension is not greater than one year]. If
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    licensing has lapsed for more than one year, the person may
    reapply for a license in the manner prescribed in the previous
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    sections of this chapter.
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         (b) A psychologist in good standing who will not be
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    practicing in the State for at least one year may petition the
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board to have the psychologist's license placed on inactive

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| 1  | status without penalty. When the psychologist wishes to return   |
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| 2  | to practice, an application shall be made to the board for       |
| 3  | [reinstatement] reactivation upon payment of the license fee for |
| 4  | the biennial period and subject to the board's review of the     |
| 5  | application as provided in its rules.                            |
| 6  | (c) Beginning July 1, 2016, through June 30, 2018, the           |
| 7  | licensee shall:  |
| 8  | (1) Pay all required fees; and                                   |
| 9  | (2) Complete a minimum of eighteen credit hours of               |
| 10 | continuing education within every license biennium.              |
| 11 | (d) All first time licensees shall not be subject to the         |
| 12 | continuing education requirement for the first license renewal.  |
| 13 | (e) Each licensee shall be responsible for maintaining the       |
| 14 | licensee's continuing education records. At the time of          |
| 15 | renewal, each licensee shall certify under oath that the         |
| 16 | licensee has complied with the continuing education requirement  |
| 17 | of this section. The board may require a licensee to submit      |
| 18 | evidence satisfactory to the board that demonstrates compliance  |
| 19 | with the continuing education requirement.                       |
| 20 | (f) Any licensee seeking renewal of a license without full       |
| 21 | compliance with the continuing education requirements shall      |
| 22 | submit with the renewal application the required fee, a          |
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| 1  | notarized arridavit setting forth the facts explaining the      |   |  |
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| 2  | reasons f   | or noncompliance, and a request for an extension on the |  |
| 3  | basis of  | the facts; provided that the licensee completes at      |  |
| 4  | least thi   | rty-six hours of continuing education for the next      |  |
| 5  | licensing   | biennium. The board shall consider each case on an      |  |
| 6  | individual basis and may grant an extension of the requirements |   |  |
| 7  | based on:   |   |  |
| 8  | (1)   | Practice in an isolated geographical area with an       |  |
| 9  |   | absence of opportunities for continuing education by    |  |
| 10 |   | taped programs or otherwise; or                         |  |
| 11 | (2)   | Inability to devote sufficient hours to continuing      |  |
| 12 |   | education because of incapacity, undue hardship, or     |  |
| 13 |   | any other serious extenuating circumstances.            |  |
| 14 | (g)   | The board may conduct random audits of licensees to     |  |
| 15 | determine   | compliance with the continuing education requirement.   |  |
| 16 | The board   | shall provide written notice of an audit to a licensee  |  |
| 17 | randomly  | selected for audit. Within sixty days of notification,  |  |
| 18 | the licen   | see shall provide the board with documentation          |  |
| 19 | verifying   | compliance with the continuing education requirement    |  |
| 20 | establish   | ed by this section."                                    |  |
| 21 | SECT  | ION 4. Section 465-13, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is      |  |
