## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PODIATRISTS.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to adopt the
 national standard of a minimum of twenty-four months in an
 accredited podiatric residency prior to licensure as a
 podiatrist.

5 SECTION 2. Section 463E-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
6 amended to read as follows:

7 "\$463E-3 Qualification for [examination.] licensure. No
8 person shall be licensed to practice podiatric medicine unless
9 the applicant has passed the examinations described in section
10 463E-4 and has been found to [be possessed of] possess the
11 necessary qualifications as required by the board.

Before any applicant shall be eligible for [the examinations,] licensure the applicant shall furnish satisfactory proof to the board that:
