# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE SMALL BUSINESS REGULATORY FLEXIBILITY ACT.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

#### PART I

2 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Act 168, Session 3 Laws of Hawaii 1998, codified as chapter 201M, Hawaii Revised Statutes, established the small business regulatory flexibility 4 5 act. Act 168 provided for a petition process to an agency for regulatory review, periodic administrative review of rules with 6 7 small business impacts, and an independent regulatory review 8 board, known as the small business regulatory review board, to 9 consider concerns of small businesses and make recommendations to adopt, amend, or repeal rules. 10

Unfortunately, the legislature also finds that the small business regulatory review board has not been functioning as originally envisioned. The legislature further finds that the small business regulatory review board's role is to look at the impact of rules on small businesses.

1 board members and the parameters of that role. Clarifying the 2 contents of the board's annual report to the legislature will 3 also assist with the efficient operation of the board. 4 The legislature further finds that a five-year sunset date 5 for the small business regulatory review board and its 6 establishing chapter should be implemented. This will enable a 7 future legislature to review the board's performance after the 8 effective date of this Act. 9 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to better ensure 10 that the small business regulatory review board functions as 11 originally envisioned by: 12 Requiring members of the small business regulatory (1)13 review board to receive training by the appropriate 14 division of the department of the attorney general to ensure that the members have a clear understanding of 15 16 the role of board members and the parameters of the 17 members' role, including the hierarchy of the Hawaii Revised Statutes and the Hawaii Administrative Rules; 18 19 (2) Clarifying the contents of the annual report that the 20 small business regulatory review board must submit to 21 the legislature; and
