A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CONTINUING COMPETENCY FOR NURSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that to ensure public
2	health, candidates for initial nurse licensure are required to
3	pass a national examination that measures the minimum
4	competencies needed to perform safely and effectively as newly
5	licensed, entry-level registered or practical nurses. In
6	today's health care environment, because technology and practice
7	are continually changing and new health care systems are
8	emerging, the challenge of licensure boards is to assure
9	consumers that nurses are competent throughout their practice
10	careers. Research shows that continuing education alone is not
11	enough to ensure competency in post-entry nurses. According to
12	the Institute of Medicine, "[A]n emerging concept includes
13	components of [continuing education] but has a broader focus,
14	such as teaching how to identify problems and apply solutions,
15	and allowing health professionals to tailor the learning
16	process, setting, and curriculum to their needs."
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The legislature further finds that continuing competency
that ensures continued patient health and safety requires

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- 1 lifelong learning and ongoing redefinition based on the
- 2 individual's experience, change in practice setting, and
- 3 educational advancement. Each nurse must maintain and augment
- 4 the necessary knowledge and skills to be current in practice.
- 5 To do this, each nurse needs a self-assessment tool that enables
- 6 the nurse to: assess and adapt to their learning needs; stretch
- 7 learning from the classroom to the point of care; match the need
- 8 for continuing education to the learning for competence; and
- 9 support increased personal accountability for lifelong learning
- 10 to ensure safe practice.
- 11 The legislature therefore finds that the Hawaii nurse
- 12 continued competency program, which contains these elements and
- 13 learning activity options, must be established for nurses
- 14 licensed in Hawaii.
- Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to require licensed
- 16 registered nurses and licensed practical nurses to submit
- 17 evidence of continuing competency at each renewal period,
- 18 beginning with the July 1, 2017 biennium.
- 19 SECTION 2. Chapter 457, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 20 amended by a new section to be appropriately designated and to
- 21 read as follows:

18		<u>(B)</u>	A board approved refresher course;
19		<u>(C)</u>	A minimum of two semester hours of post-licensure
20			academic education from an accredited nursing
21			program related to the practice of nursing;

1		(D) Fift	een contact hours of board approved
2		cont	inuing education activity and completion of
3		one	of the following:
4		<u>(i)</u>	A nursing research or evidence-based
5			practice project as principal or co-
6			<pre>principal investigator;</pre>
7		<u>(ii)</u>	Authoring or co-authoring a peer reviewed
8			published nursing or health-related article,
9			paper, book, or book chapter;
10		<u>(iii)</u>	Developing and conducting a nursing
11			education presentation or presentations
12			totaling a minimum of five contact hours;
13		<u>(iv)</u>	Six hundred forty hours of active practice
14			within the previous two years; or
15		<u>(v)</u>	Completion of a board recognized nurse
16			residency program.
17	(b)	The follo	wing are exempt from the continuing
18	competenc	e requirem	ents:
19	(1)	Registere	d nurses licensed in this State who also
20		maintain	active advanced practice registered nurse
21		licenses	in accordance with this chapter and maintain
22		a current	national certification;

1	(2)	Registered nurses licensed in this State who also
2		maintain a current national certification for the
3		nurses' practice role from a recognized national
4		certifying body;
5	(3)	First-time nurse licensees; provided that the initial
6		license was issued twelve months or less prior to the
7		renewal date. First-time nurse licensees having a
8		license initially issued more than twelve months prior
9		to the renewal date shall not be eligible for this
10		exemption and shall be required to complete the
11		following for the first renewal period:
12		(A) Fifteen units of approved continuing education
13		from a board approved provider if the nurse is a
14		registered nurse licensee; or
15		(B) Ten units of approved continuing education from a
16		board approved provider if the nurse is a
17		licensed practical nurse.
18	<u>(c)</u>	The board may extend the deadline for compliance with
19	the contin	nuing competency requirements. Prior to the expiration
20	of a licer	nse, a nurse licensee may submit a written request to
21	the board	for approval of an extension of the continuing

1	competenc	y requirements. An extension may be granted on the
2	following	grounds:
3	(1)	Illness, as certified by a physician or osteopathic
4		physician licensed under chapter 453, advanced
5		practice registered nurse licensed under this chapter,
6		or a physician, osteopathic physician, or advanced
7		practice registered nurse licensed in the jurisdiction
8		in which the nurse licensee was treated;
9	(2)	Extended active duty military service with the United
10		States armed forces;
11	(3)	Lack of access to continuing education courses due to
12		the practice of nursing in geographically isolated
13		areas; and
14	(4)	Inability to undertake the continuing competency
15		requirements due to incapacity, undue hardship, or
16		other extenuating circumstances.
17	The k	poard may consider requests for extensions on a case-
18	by-case ba	asis. Extensions shall not be granted unless proof
19	deemed app	propriate and sufficient by the board that the
20	applicant	is capable of safe practice is submitted by the
21	licensee.	Licensees unable to complete continuing competency

1	requireme	nts during the two year license renewal period and
2	after rec	eiving an extension shall be placed on inactive status
3	<u>(d)</u>	Upon application for license renewal, each licensee
4	shall:	
5	(1)	Attest under oath that the licensee has completed the
6		continuing competency requirements of this section;
7		and
8	(2)	Submit sufficient proof, as determined by the board,
9		of compliance with the board's requirements for
10		continuing competency.
11	(e)	The board may, randomly or for cause, audit a
12	licensee	s continuing competency requirements, including the
13	licensee'	s completion of competency units. The board shall
14	inform al	l licensee of the licensee's selection for audit.
15	Licensees	shall cooperate with all board conducted audits,
16	including	the furnishing of documentation or other evidence
17	showing th	he licensee's completion of competency requirements,
18	within si	xty days of the notice of audit. The board may
19	establish	guidelines for random audit and notice procedures
20	necessary	to effectuate the intent of this subsection."

1 SECTION 3. Section 457-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by adding three new definitions to be appropriately 2 3 inserted and to read as follows: 4 ""Competence" means the ability of a nurse to integrate 5 knowledge, skills, judgment, and personal attributes to practice 6 safely and ethically in a designated role or setting in 7 accordance with the scope of nursing practice. 8 "Continuing competence" means the lifelong process of 9 maintaining and documenting competence through ongoing self-10 assessment, development, and implementation of a personal 11 learning plan, and subsequent reassessment. 12 "Unit" means a relative value assigned to continuing 13 competence activities in which one continuing competence unit is 14 equivalent to at least fifty minutes of classroom or hands on 15 instruction." 16 SECTION 4. Section 457-12, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 17 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 18 In addition to any other actions authorized by law, "(a) 19 the board shall have the power to deny, revoke, limit, or 20 suspend any license to practice nursing as a registered nurse or 21 as a licensed practical nurse applied for or issued by the board 22 in accordance with this chapter, and to fine or to otherwise

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1	disciplin	e a licensee for any cause authorized by law, including
2	but not 1	imited to the following:
3	(1)	Fraud or deceit in procuring or attempting to procure
4		a license to practice nursing as a registered nurse or
5		as a licensed practical nurse;
6	(2)	Gross immorality;
7	(3)	Unfitness or incompetence by reason of negligence,
8		habits, or other causes;
9	(4)	Habitual intemperance, addiction to, or dependency on
10		alcohol or other habit-forming substances;
11	(5)	Mental incompetence;
12	(6)	Unprofessional conduct as defined by the board in
13		accordance with its own rules;
14	(7)	Wilful or repeated violation of any of the provisions
15		of this chapter or any rule adopted by the board;
16	(8)	Revocation, suspension, limitation, or other
17		disciplinary action by another state of a nursing
18		license for reasons as provided in this section;
19	(9)	Conviction, whether by nolo contendere or otherwise,
20		of a penal offense substantially related to the
21		qualifications, functions, or duties of a nurse,

1		notwithstanding any statutory provision to the
2		contrary;
3	(10)	Failure to report to the board any disciplinary action
4		taken against the licensee in another jurisdiction
5		within thirty days after the disciplinary action
6		becomes final;
7	(11)	Submitting to or filing with the board any notice,
8		statement, or other document required under this
9		chapter, which is false or untrue or contains any
10		material misstatement of fact[;], including a false
11		attestation of compliance with the continuing
12		<pre>competency requirements; or</pre>
13	(12)	Violation of the conditions or limitations upon which
14		any license is issued."
15	SECT	ION 5. The department of commerce and consumer
16	affairs,	in collaboration with the center for nursing, shall
17	convene a	stakeholder group to address any outstanding issues
18	associated	d with the implementation of the continuing competence
19	requiremen	nts pursuant to this Act and shall report to the
20	legislatu	re no later than twenty days prior to the convening of
21	the regula	ar sessions of 2015 and 2016.

- 1 SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 2 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 3 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2014, and
- 4 section 457- , Hawaii Revised Statutes, shall apply to the
- 5 licensing biennium for registered nurses and practical nurses
- 6 beginning on July 1, 2017.

Report Title:

Nurses; Registered Nurses; Practical Nurses; Continuing Competency; Licensing; Registration

Description:

Requires licensed registered nurses and licensed practical nurses to submit evidence of continuing competency at each renewal period, beginning on July, 2017. Requires the department of commerce and consumer affairs, in collaboration with the center for nursing, to convene a stakeholder group to address any outstanding issues associated with the implementation of the continuing competence requirements for nurses and report to the legislature.
