A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE BOARD OF DENTISTRY AND DENTAL HYGIENE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the name "board of 2 dental examiners" is no longer an accurate description of the board's scope and function. The legislature finds that the name 3 "board of dentistry and dental hygiene" is more appropriate 4 5 since the board regulates dentists and dental hygienists within 6 the State. Furthermore, the board no longer exists merely for purposes related to conducting licensing exams. The board now 7 8 has additional responsibilities to regulate its members and the 9 profession.

10 The legislature further finds that there are currently twelve members on the board. Eight of these members are 11 12 practicing dentists, while only two members are dental hygienists. As of November 18, 2013, there were 1,526 dentists 13 14 and 1,040 dental hygienists licensed by the State. According to these numbers, one dentist board member represents one hundred 15 ninety licensed dentists, while one dental hygienist board 16 17 member represents five hundred twenty licensed dental 18 hygienists.

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Like the eight dentist members on the board, the two dental hygienist members are practicing professionals and must arrange for time off, often as unpaid leave, to fulfill their increasing duties. It is challenging for the two dental hygienist members to carry out their growing responsibilities, which includes providing dental hygienist expertise and perspective, as compared to the eight dentists sharing board member tasks.

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8 The legislature finds that dental hygiene is one of the few health professions that is generally controlled by another 9 10 profession. Due to the significantly higher representation of 11 dentists on the board, the dental hygienists' contributions and 12 guidance are often not reflected in the board's actions. A 1993 state auditor's report noted concern with the board's failure to 13 implement its earlier recommendation to create a "better 14 balanced board since the interests of dental hygienists may 15 16 conflict with and be outweighed by those of dentists."

17 The purpose of this Act is to update the name of the board 18 of dental examiners to the board of dentistry and dental 19 hygiene, which more accurately reflects the board's scope, and 20 beginning on July 1, 2015, provide dental hygienists with 21 greater representation on the board.

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SECTION 2. Section 448-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended to read as follows:

3 "§448-5 Board of [examiners;] dentistry and dental 4 hygiene; appointment. The board of [dental examiners] dentistry 5 and dental hygiene shall consist of twelve members, eight of 6 whom shall be practicing dentists who have been engaged in the 7 practice of dentistry for a period of five years preceding their 8 several appointments, two of whom shall be practicing dental 9 hygienists, duly licensed under section 447-1, who have been 10 engaged in the practice of dental hygiene in the State for a 11 period of five years preceding appointment, and two of whom 12 shall be public members. No member shall be in any way 13 connected with, or interested financially in, any dental supply 14 company. One member in the practice of dentistry shall be 15 appointed from each of the counties of Hawaii, Maui, and Kauai 16 and five members in the practice of dentistry shall be appointed 17 from the city and county of Honolulu. As used in this chapter, 18 "board" means the board of [dental-examiners.] dentistry and 19 dental hygiene."

20 SECTION 3. Section 448-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
21 amended to read as follows:

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1	"§448-5 Board of [examiners;] dentistry and dental
2	hygiene; appointment. The board of [dental examiners] dentistry
3	and dental hygiene shall consist of [twelve] thirteen members,
4	eight of whom shall be practicing dentists who have been engaged
5	in the practice of dentistry for a period of five years
6	preceding their several appointments, [two] <u>three</u> of whom shall
7	be practicing dental hygienists, duly licensed under section
8	447-1, who have been engaged in the practice of dental hygiene
9	in the State for a period of five years preceding appointment,
10	and two of whom shall be public members. <u>A minimum of one</u>
11	member who is a practicing dentist shall have a background in
12	public health dentistry or a license in community service
13	dentistry. No member shall be in any way connected with, or
14	interested financially in, any dental supply company. One
15	member in the practice of dentistry shall be appointed from each
16	of the counties of Hawaii, Maui, and Kauai and five members in
17	the practice of dentistry shall be appointed from the city and
18	county of Honolulu. As used in this chapter, "board" means the
19	board of [dental examiners.] dentistry and dental hygiene."
20	SECTION 4. Sections 26-9, 423-1, 447-1(a), 447-1.5, 447-2,
21	447-3, 447-3.5, 447-4, 447-6, 447-7, 448-1.5, 448-2, 448-3,
22	448-7, 448-9.6, 448-11, 448-12, 448-13, 448-16, 448-22, 448-23,
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and 451D-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, are amended by substituting
 the words "board of dentistry and dental hygiene", or similar
 term, wherever the words "board of dental examiners", or similar
 term, appears, as the context requires.

5 SECTION 5. The board of dentistry and dental hygiene shall 6 develop a conflict of interest policy regarding board member 7 participation with dental examination companies that may provide 8 examinations for Hawaii dentists. The board shall report to the 9 legislature on the status of this policy no later than twenty 10 days prior to the convening of the regular session of 2015. 11 SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 12 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 13 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050;

14 provided that section 3 of this Act shall take effect on July 1, 15 2015.

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Report Title:

Board of Dentistry and Dental Hygiene; Dentistry; Dentists; Dental Hygienists; Membership

Description:

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Changes the name of the board of dental examiners to "board of dentistry and dental hygiene". Beginning 07/01/2015: increases the number of members on the board from twelve to thirteen members; requires three members to be licensed, practicing dental hygienists; and requires at least one of the practicing dentist members to be a practicing dentist with a background in public health dentistry or a license in community service dentistry. Requires the board of dentistry and dental hygiene to develop conflict of interest policies relating to dental examination companies and report back to the legislature prior to the regular session of 2015. Effective 07/01/2050. (SD1)
