A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HOUSING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that affordable housing 2 is a serious concern for many Hawaii residents. According to 3 the 2011 Hawaii housing planning study, up to 50,000 new housing 4 units will need to be built by 2016 to meet the new demand 5 generated by changing demographics and economic conditions. 6 Furthermore, native Hawaiians are disproportionately 7 represented among Hawaii's homeless at twenty-eight per cent of 8 the homeless served. The legislature finds that homelessness is 9 often a revolving door for many native Hawaiian families who 10 struggle with stability and affordable housing and that increasing the availability of housing on homestead land will go 11 12 a long way in improving the stability of native Hawaiian households. 13 14 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ 15 16 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 to

construct housing for beneficiaries on homestead land.

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- 1 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 2 Hawaiian home lands for the purposes of this Act.
- 3 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2014.
