A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that a key factor 2 influencing a student's ability to learn in public schools is 3 the learning environment. Students learn best when they are 4 physically comfortable and free from unnecessary distractions. 5 Given Hawaii's tropical climate and high temperatures, schools 6 should be equipped with air conditioning to ensure that students 7 have the most comfortable learning environment conducive to 8 fulfilling their educational potential.

9 The legislature further finds that all public school 10 classrooms in Hawaii should have air conditioning by 2019. The 11 legislature must make this a priority by appropriating 12 \$25,000,000 a year to the department of education to help reach 13 this goal.

14 The purpose of this Act is to:

15 (1) Require the department of education to plan for and
16 request funds necessary to implement acoustic noise
17 control and air conditioning at existing and new
18 school facilities;

2		standards to determine whether acoustic noise control	
3		of existing and new schools is necessary;	
4	(3)	Require the installation of air conditioning in all	
5		public schools based upon a priority list established	
6		by the department of education and according to a	
7		schedule to have air conditioning installed in all	
8		public schools by 2019; and	
9	(4)	Make an appropriation to the department of education	
10		for air conditioning in public schools.	
11	SECT	ION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
12	amended b	y adding a new section to be appropriately designated	
13	and to read as follows:		
14	" <u>§</u> 30	2A- Noise and climate control at school facilities.	
15	(a) This	section shall be known and may be cited as the First	
16	<u>Things</u> Fi	rst Act.	
17	<u>(b)</u>	The department shall plan for and request	
18	appropria	tions necessary to implement the following:	
19	(1)	Acoustic noise control of existing and new school	
20		facilities in areas that are affected by aircraft,	
21		traffic, and other noises; and	



1	(2) Air conditioning of existing and new school
2	facilities.
3	(c) The department shall develop appropriate standards and
4	consider local conditions in deciding whether acoustic noise
5	control of existing and new schools is required for effective
6	classroom instruction. The standards shall include criteria to
7	be used by the department to determine when acoustic noise
8	control is not needed.
9	(d) Where acoustic noise control of school facilities is
10	planned, the department shall utilize the services of
11	individuals qualified by training and experience to recommend
12	appropriate noise control procedures and components.
13	(e) Acoustic noise control and air conditioning shall be
14	given equal weight with all other factors in the criteria used
15	by the department in setting priorities for school construction
16	and renovations.
17	(f) The department shall establish a prioritized list for
18	the installation of air conditioning at all public schools
19	subject to this chapter; provided that schools that are in the
20	greatest need of air conditioning shall be given top priority.
21	Based on the prioritized list, air conditioning shall be
22	installed:



1	(1)	In the first twenty per cent of schools by
2		December 31, 2015;
3	(2)	In the second twenty per cent of schools by
4		December 31, 2016;
5	(3)	In the third twenty per cent of schools by
6		December 31, 2017;
7	(4)	In the fourth twenty per cent of schools by
8		December 31, 2018; and
9	(5)	In the fifth twenty per cent of schools by
10		December 31, 2019.
11	(g)	Unless otherwise provided by law, the department shall
12	use any f	unds appropriated by the legislature for air
13	condition	ing in the following manner:
14	(1)	For the installation of new air conditioning in
15		schools based on the prioritized list created pursuant
16		subsection (f);
17	(2)	If the department's priority under subsection (f) has
18		been met and there are funds remaining, the department
19		shall use the funds to repair and maintain existing
20		air conditioning units; and
21	(3)	If the department meets the requirements of paragraphs
22		(2) and (3) and there are funds remaining, the



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1		department shall deposit the funds into a separate	
2		account and such funds shall be used for air	
3		conditioning repair and maintenance at public schools	
4		as needed.	
5	(h)	For purposes of this section, funds that are	
6	appropriated to the department for air conditioning shall be		
7	considere	d expended upon the receipt of funds by the department.	
8	<u>(i)</u>	When air conditioning is installed in a public school	
9	by any en	tity other than the department or the department of	
10	accounting	g and general services, the department may require that	
11	the approximate cost of electricity and maintenance for the air		
12	conditioning be paid by a private entity until the department		
13	establish	es temperature and noise standards and a policy	
14	<u>relating</u>	to air conditioning."	
15	SECT	ION 3. There is appropriated out of the general	
16	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$25,000,000 or so	
17	much there	eof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 for	
18	the depart	tment of education to install air conditioning in	
19	public scl	hools pursuant to this Act.	
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20 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of 21 education for the purposes of this Act.

22 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.



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SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
 provided that section 3 shall take effect on July 1, 2014.
