# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MEDICAL MARIJUANA.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 329-123, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 2 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: Physicians who issue written certifications shall 3 "(a) 4 provide, in each written certification, the name, address, 5 patient identification number, and other identifying information of the qualifying patient. The department of health shall 6 require, in rules adopted pursuant to chapter 91, that all 7 written certifications comply with a designated form completed 8 9 by or on behalf of a qualifying patient. The form shall require information from the applicant  $[\tau]$  and primary caregiver, and 10 from the primary care physician, board certified pain specialist 11 12 physician, oncologist, ophthalmologist, or board certified 13 palliative care physician, as specifically required or permitted by this chapter. The form shall require the address of the 14 location where the marijuana is grown and shall appear on the 15 registry card issued by the department of health. 16 The certifying physician shall be required to be the qualifying 17 18 patient's primary care [physician.] physician, board certified 2014-1432 SB2574 SD1 SMA.doc
