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## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO NATUROPATHIC PHYSICIANS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	'ION 1	. Chapter 455, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended b	y adć	ing two new sections to be appropriately
3	designate	d and	to read as follows:
4	" <u>§</u> 45	5-A	<b>Prescription privileges.</b> (a) In order to qualify
5	for presc	ripti	on privileges, each naturopathic physician shall:
6	(1)	Comp	lete fifteen hours of continuing medical education
7		<u>in p</u>	harmacology annually, proof of which shall be
8		subn	itted to the board; and
9	(2)	Main	tain a collegial relationship with a prescribing
10		phys	ician licensed under chapter 453, who shall:
11		<u>(A)</u>	Perform a quarterly review of the list of
12			naturopathic formulary items that have been
13			prescribed by the naturopathic physician pursuant
14			to section 455-B; and
15		<u>(B)</u>	Address any concerns with naturopathic formulary
16			and amounts prescribed with the prescribing
17			naturopathic physician and the board.

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1	For	the purposes of this section, "collegial relationship"
2	means a p	rofessional relationship intended to foster cooperation
3	and colla	boration in integrative care.
4	<u>(b)</u>	No naturopathic physician shall prescribe items other
5	than item	s under categories 1 to 7 of the naturopathic formulary
6	effective	August 9, 2013, and as may be subsequently amended,
7	which cat	egories are as follows:
8	(1)	All non-prescription and prescription vitamins,
9		minerals, nutritional supplements, dietary
10		supplements, botanical medicines, homeopathic
11		medicines, and all biological substances including
12		extracts or their products and residues;
13	(2)	All hormones, with the exception of those that are
14		controlled substances;
15	(3)	Antibiotics;
16	(4)	Pain control agents;
17	(5)	Dermatologicals;
18	(6)	Ophthalmic agents; and
19	(7)	Otic agents.
20	<u>§455</u>	-B Prescription data. (a) Each naturopathic
21	physician	shall submit a monthly report to the board that lists
22	the type	and number of each prescription of naturopathic

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1	formulary prescribed by that naturopathic physician during the
2	preceding month.
3	(b) The board shall provide to the legislature an annual
4	report of prescription data required pursuant to subsection (a)
5	by December 1, 2015, and by December 1 of every year
6	thereafter."
7	SECTION 2. Section 455-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
8	amended to read as follows:
9	"§455-6 Powers and authority of the board. In addition to
10	any other powers and duties authorized by law, the board may:
11	(1) Adopt and use a seal to be affixed to all official
12	acts of the board;
13	(2) Adopt, amend, or repeal rules in accordance with
14	chapter 91 to carry out the purposes of this chapter;
15	provided that all rules shall be approved by the
16	governor and the director of commerce and consumer
17	affairs; and provided further that the rules:
18	(A) May forbid acts or practices deemed by the board
19	to be detrimental to the accomplishment of the
20	purpose of this chapter;
21	(B) Shall establish standards of practice, care, and
22	ethics; and

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1		(C) Shall establish the education and training
2		requirements for parenteral therapy and the
3		standards to administer parenteral therapy, and
4		establish examination standards and require the
5		passage of an examination on minor office
6		procedures, which standards and requirements
7		shall take effect after December 31, 2009;
8	(3)	Develop standards for licensure;
9	(4)	Issue, renew, suspend, and revoke licenses and fine
10		licensees;
11	(5)	Investigate and conduct hearings regarding any
12		violation of this chapter and any rules of the board;
13	(6)	Maintain a record of its proceedings;
14	(7)	Annually establish and publish a naturopathic
15		formulary that has been approved by the board for
16		prescription, administration, or dispensing by
17		naturopathic physicians[+], except as provided in
18		<pre>section 455-A(b); and</pre>
19	(8)	Do all things necessary to carry out the functions,
20		powers, and duties set forth in this chapter."
21	SECT	ION 3. Section 455-11, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
22	amended by	y amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
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1	"(a)	In addition to any other actions authorized by law,	
2	the board	shall have the power to deny, revoke, suspend, or	
3	refuse to	renew any license to practice naturopathic medicine	
4	applied f	or or issued by the board in accordance with this	
5	chapter, and to fine or otherwise discipline a licensee for any		
6	cause authorized by law, including but not limited to the		
7	following:		
8	(1)	Procuring, or aiding or abetting in procuring, a	
9		criminal abortion;	
10	(2)	Employing any person to solicit patients;	
11	(3)	Obtaining a fee on the assurance that a manifestly	
12		incurable disease can be permanently cured;	
13	(4)	Betraying a patient's confidence;	
14	(5)	Making any untruthful and improbable statement in	
15		advertising one's naturopathic practice or business;	
16	(6)	False, fraudulent, or deceptive advertising;	
17	(7)	Being habituated to the excessive use of drugs or	
18		alcohol; or being addicted to, dependent on, or an	
19		habitual user of a narcotic, barbiturate, amphetamine,	
20		hallucinogen, or other drug having similar effects;	

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1	(8)	Practicing naturopathic medicine while the ability to
2		practice is impaired by alcohol, drug, physical
3		disability, or mental instability;
4	(9)	Procuring a license through fraud, misrepresentation,
5		or deceit or knowingly permitting an unlicensed person
6		to perform activities requiring a license;
7	(10)	Professional misconduct or gross carelessness or
8		manifest incapacity in the practice of naturopathic
9		medicine;
10	(11)	Conduct or practice contrary to recognized standard of
11		ethics of the naturopathic profession;
12	(12)	Using medical service or treatment which is
13		inappropriate or unnecessary;
14	(13)	Submitting to or filing with the board any notice,
15		statement, or other document required under this
16		chapter which is false or untrue or contains any
17		material misstatement of fact;
18	(14)	Failure to report to the board any disciplinary action
19		taken against the licensee in another jurisdiction
20		within thirty days after the disciplinary action
21		becomes final;

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1	(15)	Using the title "physician" without clearly	
2		identifying oneself as being a naturopathic physician;	
3	(16)	Prescribing, administering, and dispensing	
4		naturopathic formulary in violation of section 455-A;	
5	[ <del>(16)</del> ]	(17) Prescribing, administering, and dispensing	
6		naturopathic formulary that are not included in the	
7		formulary established by the board under section	
8		455-6; and	
9	[ <del>(17)</del> ]	(18) Violation of any provision of this chapter or	
10		rules adopted under this chapter."	
11	SECT	ION 4. In codifying the new sections added by section	
12	1 of this	Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute	
13	appropria	te section numbers for the letters used in designating	
14	the new s	ections in this Act.	
15	SECT	ION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed	
16	and stric	ken. New statutory material is underscored.	
17	SECT	ION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2014, and	
18	shall be :	repealed on June 30, 2016; provided that sections 455-6	
19	and 455-1	1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, shall be reenacted in the	
20	form in which they read on the day prior to the effective date		
21	of this A	ct.	

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#### Report Title:

Naturopathic Medicine; Naturopathic Physicians; Prescription Privileges

#### Description:

Requires naturopathic physicians to qualify for prescription privileges by: (1) completing fifteen hours of pharmacology continuing medical education annually; and (2) maintaining a collegial relationship with a prescribing physician licensed under chapter 453. Restricts naturopathic physicians to prescribe only items under categories 1-7 of the naturopathic formulary effective August 9, 2013, and as may be subsequently amended. Requires naturopathic physicians to provide a monthly report to the board of naturopathic medicine with a list of the type and number of each prescription of naturopathic formulary prescribed. Requires the board of naturopathic medicine to annually report prescription data to the legislature. Repeals 6/30/2016. (SD1)
