A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that appropriate 2 screening can determine whether an individual as young as one 3 year old is at risk for autism and demonstrates that early 4 treatment improves outcomes. Autism Speaks, an autism science 5 and advocacy organization, estimates that one out of every 6 eighty-eight children is diagnosed with some form of autism. 7 Autism Speaks stresses the importance of recognizing the early 8 signs of autism and seeking early intervention services. 9 The legislature further finds that the federal Affordable Care Act has improved the availability of screening, diagnosis, 10
- Care Act has improved the availability of screening, diagnosis, and treatment of autism. For example, habilitative services would permit individuals with autism to access ongoing services in speech, occupational, and physical therapy when their physician prescribes it. However, behavioral health treatments such as applied behavior analysis specific to the treatment of autism have not been covered as habilitative services.
- 17 The purpose of this Act is to require health insurance to
 18 provide coverage for behavioral health treatment of autism
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- 1 spectrum disorders when it is prescribed by an individual's
- 2 physician and provided by trained professionals, at the time it
- 3 will most benefit the individual. This treatment shall be
- 4 covered by health insurance up to the age of six when the
- 5 individual with autism may receive services as required by
- 6 federal law from the department of education.
- 7 SECTION 2. Chapter 431, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 8 amended by adding a new section to article 10A to be
- 9 appropriately designated and to read as follows:

10 "S431:10A- Autism spectrum disorders; benefits and

- 11 coverage. (a) Each individual or group accident and health or
- 12 sickness insurance policy, contract, plan, or agreement issued
- or renewed in this State after December 31, 2015, shall provide
- 14 to insureds under six years of age diagnosed with an autism
- 15 spectrum disorder coverage for treatment of autism spectrum
- 16 disorders.
- 17 (b) Coverage under this section may be subject to
- 18 copayment, deductible, and coinsurance provisions of an accident
- 19 and health or sickness insurance policy that are no less
- 20 favorable than the copayment, deductible, and coinsurance
- 21 provisions for other medical services covered by the policy.

11	functional analysis of the relations between environment and			
12	behavior.			
13	"Autism spectrum disorders" means autism spectrum disorders			
14	as defined by the most recent edition of the American			
15	Psychiatric Association Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of			
16	Mental Disorders (DSM).			
17	"Behavioral health treatment" means treatment programs,			
18	including applied behavior analysis, that are:			
19	(1) Medically necessary to develop, maintain, or restore,			
20	to the maximum extent practicable, the functioning of			
21	an individual; and

2		licensed psychologist, or individual otherwise

Chapter 432, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by adding a new section to article 1 to be appropriately designated and to read as follows: 3 4 "§432:1- Autism spectrum disorders; benefits and coverage. Report Title:

Health; Insurance; Mandatory Health Coverage; Behavioral Health Treatment; Autism Spectrum Disorders

Description:

Requires health insurers, mutual benefit societies, and health maintenance organizations to provide coverage for treatment of autism spectrum disorders.

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
