#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that a center for deaf
- and hard of hearing education is necessary to support a full 2
- 3 continuum of communication options in education, including
- 4 American sign language, other forms of sign language, cued
- 5 speech, listening, and spoken language, or any combination of
