A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE STATE BUILDING CODE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the state building
 code council was created in 2007 to review and adopt current,
 nationally recognized building codes and standards for the
 State. However, the staff and operating expenses of the council
 have never been funded, thereby limiting the effectiveness of
 the work of the voting members.

7 The purpose of this Act is to refine and clarify provisions relating to the state building code council and the adoption of 8 9 Hawaii state building codes and standards, by among other 10 things, adding building industry and trade representatives to 11 the council membership, allowing staggering of the code 12 adoption, defining and clarifying terminology, ensuring that no code provisions that conflict with the laws governing 13 contractors are adopted, and appropriating funds to the 14 department of accounting and general services for the council's 15 16 operating costs.

17 SECTION 2. Section 107-21, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 18 amended as follows:

1 comptroller's designee. The council members shall serve fouryear terms [as defined in paragraphs (1) to (6)]. The voting 2 3 members shall include: 4 (1)One county building official from each of the four 5 counties appointed by the mayor; One member representing the state fire council; 6 (2) 7 [(3) One member representing the department of health who 8 has significant experience in building mechanical and 9 sewage_disposal systems; (4)] (3) One member representing the department of labor 10 and industrial relations who has significant 11 12 experience in elevator [or fire] safety; (4) One member representing the state energy office of the 13 department of business, economic development, and 14 tourism; 15 One member representing the Structural Engineers 16 (5) Association of Hawaii; [and] 17 18 (6) One member representing the American Institute of 19 Architects, Hawaii State Council[-]; (7) One member representing the Building Industry 20 21 Association of Hawaii or the General Contractors

6	SECTION 5. Section 107-24, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
7	amended to read as follows:

10	establish [a comprehensive] <u>the Hawaii</u> state building [code.]
11	codes.
12	(b) The council shall appoint a subcommittee [comprised
13	of] <u>comprising</u> the four council members representing county
14	building officials, whose duty shall be to recommend any
15	necessary or desirable state amendments to the $[model]$ codes $[-]$
16	and standards identified in section 107-25. Any recommended
17	state amendments shall require the unanimous agreement of the
18	subcommittee. The council may adopt, amend, or update codes and

5	expertise committees, which may include council members.

7	contractor associations and building trade associations to
8	gather information and recommendations on construction practices
9	and training relevant to building codes and standards.
10	(e) The council shall review and adopt, as appropriate,
11	new model building codes within eighteen months of the official
12	publication date.
13	(f) The council may make expenditures for technical
14	references, equipment and supplies, and other operating
15	expenses, and may contract for the conduct of research studies
16	and other technical services.
17	(g) The council [shall] <u>may</u> provide education and
18	technical training and administrative assistance in the form of
19	services or grants at the state and county levels relating to
20	the implementation and enforcement of the <u>Hawaii</u> state building
21	[code] codes adopted pursuant to this part.

13	without approval of the council. Each county shall [use] amend
14	and adopt the [model] Hawaii state building codes and standards
15	listed in section 107-25, as the referenced [model] Hawaii state

17	code ordinance, no later than two years after the adoption of
18	the <u>Hawaii</u> state building [code.] <u>codes.</u>
19	(b) If a county does not amend the [statewide model code]

3 SECTION 10. Section 132-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4 amended to read as follows:

5 "§132-3 Adoption of state fire code. The state fire council shall, after public hearings pursuant to chapter 91, 6 7 adopt a state fire code setting forth minimum requirements relative to the protection of persons and property from fire 8 loss including without limitation: (1) the storage, handling 9 10 and use of hazardous substances, materials and devices; and (2) 11 the control of conditions hazardous to life or property in the 12 design, use or occupancy of buildings and premises. The state fire code shall become part of the Hawaii state building [code] 13 codes as provided in section 107-25. The state fire council 14 shall meet annually to review and amend the state fire code." 15

SECTION 11. There is appropriated out of the general revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 for the state building code council and staff to carry out their duties and functions, including operating costs and staff salaries. The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of

22 accounting and general services for the purposes of this Act.

SECTION 12. This Act does not affect rights and duties
 that matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that
 were begun before its effective date.
 SECTION 13. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
 SECTION 14. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2112.
